SUFFOLK ACCIDENT RESCUE SERVICE

The Suffolk Accident Rescue Service was formed in 1972. It is a voluntary body whose aims are the provision of prompt medical treatment and care to persons in need, by reason of accident or other emergency in Suffolk, and it operates in conjunction with the existing emergency services and in no way replaces these services. The service not only covers road accidents, but also rail, air, industrial and farm accidents.

The service operates because of the problems of serious road accidents happening in such sparsely populated areas as Suffolk where, often, the nearest hospital is miles away. In such a situation there are the difficulties of getting an ambulance to the scene of the accident and of consulting a doctor. It has been shown, unfortunately, that in rural areas many victims can die in transit to hospital, or have taken longer to recover from their injuries because of the lack of prompt medical attention.

At present 106 doctors and 4 military bases are participating in the service in Suffolk. The method is that when an accident happens, the police are automatically notified and then they are able to identify immediately the doctor concerned by telephone, which means that in normal circumstances a doctor can be arriving at the scene of the accident to administer medical aid before the ambulance.

The service does not come under the National Health Service and is entirely dependent on voluntary support for its income.
