PARISH COUNCIL

The District Council has confirmed that it considers that the use of the site in Combs Lane permitted by the Secretary of State on appeal is use as a Gipsy Caravan Site and for no other purpose.

The waste disposal on the land next to the B1115 at Finborough Bridge has been referred to the County Council for action under the planning regulations.

The Council has enquired when the Conservation Team expects to undertake the clearance of City Lane.

Nominations for the 1983 Parish Council elections close on 19th April.

The Council has requested discussions with the District Council over proposals for the provision of motor vehicle hardstanding for residents of The Bungalows, High Road.

Following approaches by residents, the Council has requested the provision of two street lights for Oak Close.

The Parish Meeting will be held on Friday, 25th March, 1983 at 7 pm prior to the normal Parish Council Meeting.

A transport guide giving timetables for buses and trains in West Suffolk has been placed on the Pettward Hall noticeboard.

PARISH CHARITIES

A donation of £50 has been given by the landlord and customers of the Chestnut Horse to the Town Estate Charity for distribution to the elderly of the parish. Mr. Smale and his customers have given some £100 in this way over the last few years - a very generous effort.

The trustees of the Roger Pettward, Town Estate and William Hatten Charities have applied to the Charity Commission for a Scheme to create one charity for the parish. The new united charity would be given new objects in order to provide grants to individuals or institutions in need as and when required rather than the existing Christmas 'dole'. It was felt that the limited income available could be put to more effective use in a small number of cases where it was really needed. A response to the proposals put to the Charity Commission is awaited. No doubt the subject will be aired at the Parish Meeting.
