INTER VILLAGE QUIZ

The Mid Suffolk Finals of the Inter Village Quiz were held in the Pettiward Hall on Monday, 3rd February. In front of a large and appreciative audience, Great Finborough lost in the first semifinal to the eventual winners, Ashfield by 139 points to 109. The contest was quite even until about half way through the questions when the home team came unstuck on the subject of 'Space Travel' when Ashfield were able to amass 21 points without reply. It was later learned that Ashfield had a keen astromoner in their team.

The second semi-final saw the Offton/Willisham team defeat Stowlangtoft by the narrow margin of 137 points to 133. Had the Stowlangtoft team answered their final question correctly they would have won by a single point.

The final resulted in a comprehensive victory for Ashfield over Dffton/Willisham by 152 points to 115. At no point did Ashfield look like being caught up. Our congratulations to them now that they represent Mid Suffolk in the County Finals.

Finally, our thanks to those involved in the catering for the event — a most enjoyable spread.
