## GT. FINBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL

### School Green and Car Parking

The Parish Council has met representatives of the Suffolk Council on site (plus the Buxhall Parish Council Chairman) and the outcome of the discussions were:

(a) it is safer for the cars to use the green for parking rather than the adjoining roads;

(b) placing of stones or bollards along the edge of the green immediately opposite the school would exacerbate the situation concerning parking;

(c) the school staff/governors would continue to seek the co-operation of parents to park their cars away from the green and adjacent roads;

(d) efforts by the school governors to provide a direct pedestrian access to Middlefield Drive (where cars could be parked) from the school grounds will continue;

(e) residents living in the vicinity and who use school green are requested to park their cars on the green out of the visibility of drivers emerging onto the B1115 from the Buxhall direction;

(f) provision of flashing speed limit signs was not applicable, according to the County road Safety Officer.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Wednesday, 28th November, at 7.30 pm in the Pettiward Hall.

## STOWMARKET AND DISTRICT LEARNING ACTIVITIES IN RETIREMENT

### ART APPRECIATION

The Art History Group has studied French 19th Century Painting and 20th Century European. More recently, British painting has been discussed beginning with Tudor portraiture and including foreign artists who stayed in this country: Holbein, Hilliard, Dobson, Van Dyck, Hogarth, Reynolds, Gainsborough; Seascapes: Scott, Canaletto; Landscapes: Wilson, Alexander and Robert Cozens, Thomas Girtin. The Public Library provides an extensive collection of books obtained from all over the County. A good selection of slides is also used. The main facts of the artist's life is given, researched, sometimes by different members of the group if they so wish. Paintings are discussed in quite a lot of detail and at other times members browse through the books which can be taken home to study further. The Group meets once a fortnight on Friday mornings, 10.30 am to 12.30 pm. More members are needed to make the group viable. As from 5th October, 19th Century English painting will be studied including Constable, Turner, the Norwich School, Blake, Palmer and the Pre-Raphaelites. ### STUDY OF CHURCHES

Prior to the summer recess, a number of local churches were visited, including Stowmarket, Combs and Bury St. Edmunds. Norman Olney has compiled a suggested programme of visits for the months ahead. The next meeting on Monday, 8th October at 2.30 pm at the Youth and Resource Centre, Childer Road, Stowmarket, will be to discuss inviting an expert to assist the group in preparing for a visit and giving some guidelines on what to look for to help make the visit interesting and worthwhile.

### LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

This group have so far been involved in a brief look at Stowmarket. During the coming weeks they will be looking into the broader aspects of East Anglia, gradually working around and returning to Stowmarket and the present day. The next meeting is 3rd October at 10 am at 9 Dane-

scourt Avenue, Stowmarket. The group meets fortnightly on Wednesdays.

#### GREEN ECONOMICS

David Chapman, who convened our Electoral Reform Group, has published his work and has been invited to lecture at a number of venues at home and abroad, thus causing a delay in the starting of the Green Economics Study Group. Topics for the group concern how our present economic system damages the environment; what can be done about it; eco-taxes versus legal controls; the present Government's Green Bill; rainforests; greenhouse effect; holes in the ozone layer, etc. The first meeting of this group is now planned for **Thursday, 15th November** at 2.30 pm at the Youth and Resource Centre, Children Road, Stowmarket. David is going to be very difficult to contact whilst he is on his travels so please just come along on the 15th.

#### LITERATURE

This group has been meeting throughout the summer and have studied single subjects, e.g., *The Sonnet*, East Anglian Writings' as continuity of attendance has been difficult during the holiday period. In the next few meetings we shall study *The Novel*, initially in general terms, then as an example William Golding's *Lord of the Flies*, studying and discussing it in some depth. In future meetings short stories will be studied, the various forms of poetry, essays, plays, letters and diaries, covering works of various periods from 15th Century onwards. At each meeting, part of the time is devoted to readings which members choose themselves. These may be of prose or poetry, fiction or fact and often give rise to interesting discussions within the whole group. Meetings are held fortnightly on Tuesday mornings, 10.30 am to 12.30 pm at 3 Violet Hill Road, Stowmarket. The next meeting will be 9th October and 23rd October.

#### MUSICAL APPRECIATION

An afternoon's enjoyment listening to the favourite records of the Group members and comparing different conductors interpretations of compositions as well as enriching our minds with musical tastes of others. The Group meets fortnightly on Mondays at 2.30 pm at 15 Birch Road, Onehouse. Next meeting: 15th October.

#### MONTHLY MEETINGS

Always held on the third Wednesday of the month at Youth and Resources Centre, Childer Road, Stowmarket. Harry Miller has arranged an interesting selection of speakers, covering many topics. The meetings are advertised in the library at Stowmarket and Needham Market and on notice boards in villages and on local Radio. Part of the meeting time is given to receiving reports from the Study Groups and there is also time for socialising over a cup of tea.

The Meetings are open to anybody interested - just come along and find out what S.T.A.R. is doing and can do for you.
