

Haughley Hoofers Ladies

Haughley Hoofers practice and dance in a particular style of Morris dancing. North West Morris dances were originally performed in and around Cheshire and Lancashire as processional dances. As this was the centre of the woollen industry and clogs were the common footwear of the workers we retain that tradition and still dance in clogs today. We also use bobbins decorated with ribbons and bells.

Ninety percent of the time we only use three steps, skip, polka and march. We find the dancing keeps us fit and fills at least one evening a week in the Winter. During the Spring and Summer we dance for clubs; sometimes outside pubs; at folk festivals; in parades; and at local fetes. We sometimes spend short holidays abroad meeting up with foreign sides, or we may join other English sides for dance weekends. This year we ran our own very successful dance weekend. About 15 dance groups took part and we entertained in Diss, Bressingham and Bury St Edmunds.

We begin our Winter practices on Sunday 12 October in Haughley Village Hall, Haughley at 7.30 pm. Please come along and join us, or if you feel you would like to just watch that will be fine. Contaminated Manure – Warning

Garden Organic (HDRA) and the RHS have this year received an unprecedented number of calls from people all over the country concerned about damage to home-grown crops.

Manure and straw from non-organic farms and stables contaminated with toxic herbicides are reaching home gardeners and affecting salads and vegetables. Typical symptoms are stunted or distorted growth, cupped or fernlike leaves. Herbicides responsible are mainly sold (to farmers) under the trade name *Forefront* and *Pharaoh*. The active ingredient they contain is aminopyralid, manufactured by Dow Agrosciences.

Crops particularly sensitive to these herbicides include legumes (peas, beans) the beet family, carrots, parsnips and other umbellifers, potatoes, tomatoes and the lettuce family.

Distorted and stunted growth can of course have other causes – accidental misuse of lawn weed killer, spray drift from agricultural or amenity land for example. If the problem occurs where you have used farmyard/stable manure and not elsewhere, it is highly likely that the cause is aminopyralid. If you have used farmyard manure on your veggie plot or allotment and do not have any symptoms of disease you can probably heave a sigh of relief – but be careful.

So what can you do if you believe you have used contaminated manure? The Pesticide Safety Directorate says that the risk from eating any affected crops is minimal although the potential effects are not known. Garden Organic and RHS advise:

- Avoid gathering fruit from bushes mulched with it
- Best not to compost contaminated plants
- Do not dispose of manure or diseased plants through the council green waste sites or bins

- Don't use any more of this manure; rake off any which is still visible.
- Bag up unused manure and return to vendor or contact me for advice on disposal
- Don't use land treated with contaminated manure until at least Spring 2009 and then only after testing with a cheap but sensitive crop such as lettuce
- Do help the micro-organisms in the soil to break down the herbicide quicker by digging or rotavating several times in summer
- Do check with your supplier that manure comes from a source where aminopyralid is not used.
- Make your own compost!

Waste Disposal

Green waste causes many problems as people think that because it will rot down it can be deposited anyway. This is not true. Rotting vegetation is unsightly and it smells. The dumping of it can lead to a criminal conviction, a fine of up to £50,000.00 and/or imprisonment. Those persons who deposit rubbish including green waste will be tracked down and will be placed before the courts. Recently a local householder who deposited an amount of ivy clippings was fined £1250. Mid Suffolk will use all the resources it has to tackle such crimes including the use of covert surveillance and remote video cameras hidden in hotspots.

Off the High Road and opposite Borough Lane a large amount of green waste has been deposited at the entrance onto Footpath 31. The Council will clear this area when possible but those persons who have regularly been depositing their waste at this spot or any other areas should be aware that the Authority is watching them and will take action.

From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends, The Parochial Church Councils in this benefice, which have responsibility for the running of your local parish churches, are currently exploring our priorities as the church in this place. We want to be pro-active rather than reactive and to carefully consider how we serve the villages in which we minister.

The parish system in this country goes back to Anglo-Saxon England and it ensures that every individual in the country – regardless of any personal membership of religious groups (or none) – has a church and a priest to which they can turn in times of need. The parish church has an important role, therefore, not only as the centre of worship for the Christians in that place but as a figurehead for spirituality in the village. It is a representation of the history of the village; a public and open place for remembrance, doubt, grief, tears, laughter and celebrations as diverse as Remembrance Sunday and family rituals.

William Temple, Archbishop of Canterbury at the turn of the 19th century said "A church is the only organization that exists primarily for the benefit of non-members."

So it is that as we consider our priorities for the future, 'the village' is a vital element in how we tailor ourselves for the demands that may be made of us in the coming years. This is why some of the parishes in this group (Buxhall, Great Finborough, Harleston, Onehouse, Shelland) will be advertising open meetings over the coming months to invite you to come and join our discussions. Other churches in the group will send out letters inviting you to contribute your views on how we can best serve the needs of the people in these parishes.

Youthwork, childrens' work, social gatherings, more formal worship, more relaxed worship, open church buildings, greater use of the building, musical events, communication,

environmental work – whatever your priorities we need to *know* if we are going to respond.

There is another side to this coin, however. Although the parish church is your church, in each church we are only a relatively small body of worshippers and there is only so much we alone can achieve. We need 'people of goodwill' to work with us if we are going to do any more than we are already doing, or indeed in some cases if we are to continue as we are. If we are truly going to serve these villages, these parishes, we cannot do it alone – and need you.
