

#### Jewellery amnesty at your local Hospice shop

Do you have any unwanted or broken jewellery and accessories? St Elizabeth Hospice is holding a jewellery amnesty from Monday 23 March to Saturday 28 March. #### Climbing new heights at Leisure Centre

Visitors to Mid Suffolk Leisure Centre in Stowmarket will be able to climb to new heights now a brand new climbing wall has been unveiled. The purpose built bouldering wall, which will be built into one of the existing squash courts, has been designed with a combination of curved shapes and menacing overhangs, as well as a mix of overlaps, arêtes and grooves. Bouldering is a fast growing sport in its own right, and

involves lower level climbing with the emphasis upon technical skill.

The existing bouldering wall will be converted into a traverse wall, for climbers to warm up on before using the top roping wall or the new bouldering wall. There will also be a new higher section installed on the main top roping wall so it will now be up to eight metres high. The wall has been funded by Mid Suffolk District Council, working in partnership with SLM who operate the facility.

Nick Hart, Manager of The Cragg, said: 'This is an exciting development which will really enhance the climbing facilities at the Mid Suffolk Leisure Centre. Bouldering is an increasingly popular activity which is a great introduction to climbing, and the extra height on the main wall will also be an added challenge.'

## Mid Suffolk District Council Waste and Environmental Services Update

Welcome to the first Mid Suffolk Waste and Environmental Services update. Each update will keep you informed of what the teams have been doing and key issues for the departments for the next few months....we hope you find it of interest!

A deep clean of Stowmarket Town Centre has taken place over the last few weeks. One of the main issues of concern was the amount of chewing gum that had to be steamed off the pavement with specialist equipment before the clean could take place. If cigarette butts were not thrown away carelessly and chewing gum was discarded correctly in a bin, savings could be made on street cleansing costs. Our road sweeper vehicles and grounds maintenance teams have been out and about in the district collecting leaves and carrying out a winter prune of bushes and trees.

Springtime spurs village organisations and community clear up groups into action. Twenty three parishes currently arrange community clear ups with equipment supplied by MSDC. These events are normally a lot of fun and make a cleaner nicer environment for everyone to live in. If your village or community group wish to set up a community clear up contact Sarah Carter, the Environmental Services Officer at MSDC, on 01449 724500. MSDC may be able to assist you with the supply of a litter picking kit.

#### Christmas Tree Collections

The Waste and Recycling Team has received a good response from collecting the Christmas trees for recycling this year. Our Recycling Officers were out on a frosty winter's mornings collecting the Christmas trees with the contractors Serco. A total of 2280kg was collected and taken to County Mulch for composing.

#### New Tetra Pak Recycling Banks

Tetra Pak (juice/milk carton) recycling banks have been introduced. They have been such a success that we will be adding another two sites. The nearest new one is at Hurstlea Road, Needham Market but you can also use the Stowmarket main site. Please check <a href="https://www.recycle-more.co.uk">www.recycle-more.co.uk</a> for recycling banks near you.

#### Excess Packaging at Easter

Remember to recycle your Easter egg boxes, plastic holders and aluminium foil. All of these items can be recycled if separated and placed individually into the recycling bins. Alternatively you could think about packaging when you are shopping. Easter eggs are now more commonly available without the box: why pay for excess packaging?

#### Garden Waste Collection Service

To help make recycling easier for residents, Mid Suffolk District Council has introduced a garden waste collection service throughout the district. The service is available to all households - subject to availability and suitability of access. To enquire about the service, please contact 0845 6066045 or visit www.midsuffolk.gov.uk. The charge for the service is £40.00 a year. For that, households will receive a 240 litre brown bin and a fortnightly collection of garden waste. The service operates all year round except for Christmas and New Year holiday weeks. The garden waste that is collected is emptied into a dedicated vehicle and sent to a local facility to be shredded and recycled into soil improver.

#### **Ipswich Hospital**

Foundation trusts provide services with greater freedoms from the Department of Health. They are still subject to NHS standards and inspections but are able to make decisions that best meet the needs of local people. Members can be involved as much or as little as they like, from simply receiving newsletters to becoming active in forums, fundraising and volunteering.

Chief Executive Andrew Reed said: "Becoming a foundation trust will help us deliver the best hospital care for our community in the future. Patients will not only have a chance to be part of the decision-making process, but will also have access to more information about the current services and future plans allowing them to make informed choices about where to have treatment".
