

News from the Parish Council The Village Appraisal ...Is Here At Last

You should now have had a copy of the Village Appraisal questionnaire. Please take the trouble to read it carefully and complete one for your household. It is an important source of information so that the Parish Council can ensure it is reflecting the views of the majority on a range of important

issues for the village. Your completed questionnaire will be collected from you. There is also a youth questionnaire for completion by each young person in the village, which will also be collected. This really matters.

Village Play Area

Isn't it bizarre that what most view as a great new facility can cause disharmony in our community? As you know, the Community Council, open to everyone in the village, was set up to manage the operation of village facilities including the Pettiward Hall, the new play area and car park. This is a group of volunteers who manage the facilities that we own as a community, via the Parish Council - your elected representatives.

All along the Community Council has been keen to ensure the provision of a safe play area for small children, as well as to ensure that the area is looked after properly so it remains, in the future, as good as it is now. It is necessary to have a few simple rules about play area use to ensure that equipment is used safely and that the facility is not a nuisance to near neighbours. This requires the active co-operation of all in the community.

A small minority have engaged in thoughtless and childish behaviour from those who are old enough to know better. This includes frequent climbing back into the play area after it is locked, obscene graffiti, misuse of play equipment and uprooting of posts, as well as urinating on, and cycling among, the planting. What a shame. How sad that we can't all look after what we've got and what a lot of villages crave.

Misuse of community facilities is not an option. We do not want to lose a facility we have only just acquired, or indeed curtail those that are in the pipeline like the playing field also to be developed. The resolution of this issue lies with us. No

doubt the play area has had novelty value, but it is time now that the misbehaviour stops. If it does not, with regret the Parish Council will have to consider appropriate action. We should not have to do this and do not want to, but we will not shirk from what we have to.

The Parish Council will consider the operation of the play area again on Monday 7 September at 7.30pm in the Pettiward Hall. If you have any views, please come to the meeting and share them.

Village Caretaker

The Parish Council is recruiting a paid part-time Village Caretaker to help maintain the Pettiward Hall, the play area and car park and other facilities that will be developed in due course. Full details of the role are available from Councillor Liz Michie on 613699 or lizmichie@btinternet.com. It will include locking up, Hall cleaning, keeping the village tidy, grass cutting and basic maintenance jobs. It may well be suitable for a job share to ensure continuous cover. Fundamental is a passion for our community and dedication to looking after it. The closing date for applications is Thursday 10 September 2009.

Village Car Park

You may well see a DHL lorry in the car park on Thursday 24 September. Don't worry, we haven't lost our wits. The lorry is involved in a lesson for the village school children and as long as the car park can stand the weight it will be parked there that day only.

Speed Camera

The speed camera project is still in the hands of the Police, but we still need three volunteers for Great Finborough. We have three already and need three more. Please contact me if you are interested (including those who did previously). The role is not to stand in for the Police, it is simply to use the

speed camera – within strictly defined parameters – and record the registration numbers of speeding motorists. These are passed to the Police who do the rest. **Richard Brice**

Triangle Opposite the Primary School

The Parish Council was concerned that following the recent refurbishment work, this area seemed to have been forgotten. Suffolk County Council was approached and they advised that the area would be added to the mowing schedule. Rodney Self, the Tree Warden, reported that the replacement tree would be available for planting later in the year.

A New Salt Bin

Following comments received from parishioners about the unsightly pile of road salt outside the church, the Parish Council agreed to install a salt bin which will appear in due course.

Dropped Kerbs at The Chestnuts

The Parish Council has asked Suffolk County Council to consider installing dropped kerbs on either side of The Chestnuts entrance, to allow a more convenient crossing for wheelchairs and prams.

News from your District Councillor *Planning*

You may have read that further land bids have now been rejected through our 'sieving' process. I can confirm that none of the sites put forward in Great Finborough will be considered further, but the various bids in Onehouse are still favoured. In addition, the Forge Caravan Park, which already has permission for use as a gypsy and traveller site, is retained for that purpose. All these are as yet only recommendations, not decisions. There will be further opportunities for public comment and objection, but the likely outcomes are becoming clearer.

I am very much in favour of the Mid Suffolk Pre-Application Service being used more to minimise disagreements between applicants, objectors and Parish Councils. It is intended to give you a clear picture of the likely outcome of a planning application if you make one. Our Pre-Application Service is intended to:

- ♦ Identify potential planning issues
- ◆ Clarify the information we will need to properly consider your application
- ♦ Highlight things that might need to be the subject of limitation or condition on any permission we grant
- ♦ Identify possible reasons why we might refuse to give you permission.

Recycling

Mid Suffolk residents are still streets ahead when it comes to recycling and minimising their waste. Figures released by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, which measures the level of waste for each council in the UK, show that Mid Suffolk District Council is still top of the national league for the amount of dry recyclables collected, for a third year running.

This year, Mid Suffolk residents have even managed to improve on the 2008/09 effort. When comparing the periods April-June 2008 with April-June 2009 our figures have increased from 38.67% to 42.31%.

A Mr Rudderham, writing in the Bury Free Press, criticised councils collecting green wastes, arguing that this should be

composted where it originated. I have some sympathy with this, and would encourage householders to compost whenever they can. However, there are people living in flats and homes with very small gardens, and there are folk no longer as young and fit as they were. The MSDC brown bin scheme continues to be very popular so I support collection for those who need it. Air Training Cadets Service to the Community

In the June newsletter I asked if anyone could offer opportunities for the Air Training Cadets based at Wattisham to carry out some community work. As a result of this the cadets took on the task of updating records of graves in the churchyard at St Andrew's church. The last time this was done was in June 1999.

On 13 August six members of the 1287 (Wattisham) Squadron of the Air Training Corps, led by their Service Instructor, carried out the survey. The cadets who participated were Shelley Sutton, Ben Harrison, Joe Leaver, Tom Biddulph, Alex Raymond and Adam Todd.

The cadets did a range of tasks requiring computer skills, photography and surveying. Previous surveys used typewritten records and sketches but this was the first time that digital cameras and computers had been used. Thanks to the cadets the church now has detailed records of graves for the last ten years. It is intended that this information will be soon added to the earlier records on the village website.

The cadets worked hard all day with only a brief break for lunch, kindly provided by Leonel Girao at the Chestnut Horse. Help a Neighbour - Become a Flu Friend

We all need help from family, friends or neighbours if we get the flu but help is even more important for people who are vulnerable, infirm or old. NHS Suffolk is urging people and community organizations to look out for people they know of in their area who may be vulnerable. Please become a Flu Friend to them should the need arise.

People using the National Pandemic Flu Service who have swine flu symptoms will be given a unique access number and told where their antiviral medication can be collected from their nearest antiviral collection point by their Flu Friend - someone who does not have swine flu. The antiviral collection points are in pharmacies so you will not have far to travel.

The National Pandemic Flu service gives people with pandemic swine flu symptoms fast access to antivirals. The website is at https://www.pandemicflu.direct.gov.uk/

The telephone service is on 0800 1 513 100. The website is available 24 hours a day; the 'phone line from 8am until midnight.

As a flu friend, you must show your own ID as well as that of the patient. ID you can use includes a utility bill, passport, credit or debit card, driving licence or NHS card. Advice remains that anyone who suspects they have swine flu should not go to their GP or A&E but certain people should contact their doctor directly by telephone, rather than using the National Pandemic Flu Service, if:

- They have a serious underlying illness
- They are pregnant
- They have a sick child under one year old
- Their condition suddenly gets much worse, or
- If their condition is still getting worse after 7 days (5 for a child).

From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

The Flu pandemic rolls on with this roller-coaster that lifts us up to tell us that swine flu is no worse than seasonal flu and then drops us down again into panic with threats of tens of thousands of deaths. Echoes of 'Don't Panic', and 'We're all dooomed!' reverberate around. Some of us descend into fatalism others are subject to fits of irrational paranoia. I stood in the shower the other day and wound myself up good and thoroughly with the thought of who will look after the children if we all go down with flu at the same time?

Even the Church of England has found herself caught up the general desire to be seen to be *doing* something to reduce the risk of transmission. The Bishops of England and Wales have instructed local clergy not to share the chalice at Holy Communion. Hopefully this is a short term measure, and we are doing our best to keep the symbols of our worship strong.

The hold that any kind of fear can have over us is hard to shake off. We can find ourselves confined by it, or sometimes foolishly reckless. We can find there is no place within our minds or hearts from which we can look dispassionately at our fear. At times of fear we need another to reassure, to defend and to comfort. Little children climb into a lap for comfort, but as adults we must stand on our own feet...

Everywhere in the Bible we hear the angels telling us 'do not be afraid', but I still find the words of Julian of Norwich most comforting:

"[Jesus] showed me something small, about the size of a hazelnut, that seemed to lie in the palm of my hand as round as a tiny ball. I tried to understand the sight of it, wondering what it could possibly mean. The answer came: 'This is all that is made.' I felt it was so small that it could easily fade to

nothing; but again I was told: 'This lasts and it will go on lasting forever because God loves it. And so it is with every being that God loves.' I saw three properties about this tiny object. First, God had made it; second, God loves it; and third, that God keeps it." (Revelation of Love, translation: John Skinner).

No matter how grown up, how independent or even how alone we feel; however confusing the reality. There is always one who will be there to hold and to reassure us. Yours in Christ,
