Everyone is invited to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual General Meeting of The Community Council which will take place at 7.30pm on Monday 18 January 2010 in the Pettiward Hall.

All parishioners of Great Finborough aged 18 years and upwards are entitled to attend the meeting and vote. ## **Know your limits**

NHS Suffolk is supporting the Government's *Know Your Limits* campaign, which is encouraging people across the country to take stock of how much they are drinking and to pledge to drink within recommended 'sensible' limits.

When pouring your own drinks at home, it is easy to drink more than you would normally. We might not realise just how much we are drinking, as we often do not measure the amount. Keeping a drink diary for a week is easy, and can really make you stop and think about whether you ought to be cutting back.

More than a quarter of the population in England drink above the recommended guidelines. This can increase the risk of heart disease, breast cancer, liver disease, stroke and other diseases. Drinking above lower-risk guidelines can also impact on your ability to get a good night's sleep and affect your general day-to-day health.

The Chief Medical Officer's guidelines on lower-risk drinking recommend men do not drink more than 3-4 units daily (about one-and-a-half pints of beer) and women do not drink more than 2-3 units daily (a large glass of wine or three single measures of spirits). The table below reminds us how many units are in the most common beverages:



## From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

As I approach Christmas this year it is with a touch of sadness I will be saying goodbye to all the friends that I have made here over the past four years or so. My celebrations will be militated by my bringing my ministry here to a close and winding things up ready to move on. My sense of disharmony is minor and temporary but many people find themselves out of tune with the celebrations every year. They are surrounded by people talking about Christmas being for the children while they have none and long for them. Or, they see families coming together for Christmas whilst their own family is a source of anger and abuse. Or, they remember Christmases past in painful contrast with a present that is missing someone they love very much. Perhaps they struggle daily with depression and find the jollity of Christmas unbearable, or maybe they are lonely and that loneliness is re-enforced at Christmas time.

It is into that disharmony that Christmas most powerfully speaks. For the Christmas story is set in a time when for the People of God the world looked very bleak indeed. The Roman Empire loomed over the tiny country of Palestine like some story-book ogre, hungry to assimilate everyone into its own image. Terrorists lurked in the hills and to cap it all, the king was obsessively suspicious; murdering his wife, generals, his own children – anyone he feared threatened his throne.

Into this world was born Jesus, son of Mary, a child Christians believe was God himself. The Light that shines in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it. He was born not into peaceful celebrations and goodwill but into the disorder and disruption of huge population movement. He was born to *scatter the proud* and *lift up the lowly*, to *fill the hungry with good things* and *send the rich away empty*. God is the father to the orphan and husband to the widow. Christmas is above all things the reminder that he changes our world.

So whether or not Christmas comes as a blessing this year, may you find in it God's power to redeem the burdens we carry and to transform darkness to light, the humdrum into the extraordinary. God himself became part of his own creation so that he might lift us up, however low we might find ourselves. Christmas is a season of hope as we look on the baby that is God's love for the world and rejoice. Have a blessed Christmas,
