

News from the Parish Council

Power of Wellbeing

The Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 provides a number of new powers to town and parish councils, the most significant of which is the rather oddly named "power of wellbeing". This potentially gives parish councils a general power to spend money on any activity which adds to the wellbeing of its community, i.e. it gives the parish council more freedom to operate for the benefit of the community outside previous legislative restraints. There are new criteria which each council has to meet if they wish to exercise the power. This includes specific training – which our parish councilors have undertaken – and public consultation prior to adopting the new power. The Parish Council will consider whether it wishes to formally adopt the power of wellbeing at its next full meeting on Monday 1 March at 7.30pm in the Pettward Hall. All welcome.

Youth Shelter

The Parish Council has applied for a grant of £10,000 from Suffolk County Council (SCC) towards the purchase of a Youth Shelter for locating next to the new football pitch. If we are successful, it will be solar-powered and have radio (one volume), wifi and bluetooth technology. However, there's no guarantee we'll get the money. SCC has £40,000 to spend on community projects, although grants are limited to a maximum of £10,000. The deal on this is that because they have more requests for grants than cash available, the allocation of grants will be decided by public online voting via this link: www.onesuffolk.co.uk/yourplacematters/vote

Voting is open until 31 March. It is vital that we "get our vote out" in Great Finborough and anyone who is under 19 has a single vote. All this will be publicised via schools and please encourage any young people who meet the voting criteria (see the website) to vote.

Multi-User Games Area

We have now given Gipping Homes an indication of our aspiration for a Multi-User Games Area to be located on what would otherwise be a 5-a-side football pitch. Youth Café members and other young people consulted would ideally like an all-weather court, marked up for both

football and basketball. As might be imagined this is expensive and we are looking creatively at ways as to how this might be sensibly funded.

Pettiward Hall

Rumours that the Hall is closing for refurbishment are quite simply wrong. A feasibility study is currently taking place as to how the Hall might be modernised. Before anything definite happens there will be the opportunity for everyone who is interested to see possible plans and comment on the options. Even if we decide as a community to do something, we will have to raise the money first, so talk of closures really is premature.

Community Council

The purpose of the Community Council is to discharge the management of the village amenities which include the car park, conservation area, future 5-a-side pitch, the Pettiward Hall and the play area. At the January 2010 meeting the trustees were appointed: Cathy Croome, Angela Mulligan, Kath Burlinson and Richard Brice. Cathy was elected Secretary and Chris Grady as Treasurer. A new Chair is needed.

Meetings are taking place with the architect working with the village on the refurbishment of the Pettiward Hall. Legal loose ends still need tying up by Mid Suffolk District Council before the Conservation Area will be handed over to the Parish Council. Rodney Self has prepared a Management Plan for the woodland/conversation area as required by MSDC. Further discussions are taking place with regard to the sports field and landscaping of the car park. Meeting dates this year are 7.30pm on: 15 March, 19 April, 17 May, 21 June, 19 July, 20 September, 18 October, 15 November and 20 December.

News from your District Councillor

Local Government Reorganisation

Now that the Government has at last made a (sort of) definite decision about this, and will *not impose* one (or two) very large councils to provide all services in Suffolk, the project to merge the operations of Mid Suffolk & Babergh will continue, with the support of all political parties in both councils. I very much welcome this approach of change *by agreement*, and it is also what Government has suggested: '*...to invite all the Suffolk councils, with their Members of Parliament, consulting other stakeholders and through a county constitutional convention, to reach a consensus on a unitary solution for that area*'. I am hopeful that can be carried out far more cheaply than the increasingly absurd Boundary Committee process, and that the cost of council services can be contained by merging them with Babergh.

Stowmarket Plan Latest

The new Submission Draft should be available for public comment from 12 April to 24 May, and Onehouse Parish Council have arranged a Councillors Surgery for 17 April to make the new material available in the village.

Budget and Council Tax Bills

Subject to final approval by County and District councillors, bills locally are likely to go up about 3%. A smaller rise than many previous years, but necessitating some small cuts and price rises for chargeable services. Government grants for 2010/11 have risen only half a per cent - below inflation - putting pressure on Council Tax.

Are You Ready For This Year's General Election?

A General Election can be called at any time, with a minimum of 17 working days between the announcement and polling day. The election must take place by 3 June 2010. Mid Suffolk District Council is urging residents not to wait until the date has been announced before they secure their right to vote. The time between the election date being announced and the last chance to register to vote can be a matter of a few days. If you are not on the Electoral Register, you won't be able to vote.

Sometimes people do not realise they need to re-register every year. Mid Suffolk District Council sent you a registration form last Autumn, but if you are not sure you returned it, or if you have moved house since then and have not registered with your new details, you need to register now.

You can register to vote if you are a British, Irish or qualifying Commonwealth citizen. You can also register if you are an EU citizen resident in the UK as you are eligible to vote in local elections - but not the General Election. British citizens living abroad can also register to vote as long as they have been on the electoral register at a UK address no more than 15 years ago. There are also special provisions for those serving abroad to vote.

For more information, or to register to vote, go to www.aboutmyvote.co.uk (the website of the independent elections watchdog, the Electoral Commission). Registering to vote only takes a few minutes. You can either print off a form the website or telephone 01449 724672.



Every year, local bell ringers of the North West District of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers get together to try and consolidate what they have learnt at their practices with a Quarter Peal Week. The aim is to ring a quarter peal at as many of our towers as possible. This includes all the towers in the Stowmarket, Thingoe, Ixworth, Mildenhall and Hartismere Deaneries. Ringing a quarter peal is a significant achievement for bell ringers. It is 45 minutes of sustained ringing, using only memory and technical skill to ring the required changes. On top of that, it is musical and the quality of ringing is high. It is traditional to ring a quarter peal for a church event, or a special occasion such as a wedding, or in memory of someone.

In 2010, the Quarter Peal Week will take place between 11 and 18 April. We invite you to sponsor the quarter peals at Buxhall and Great Finborough for the charity *Help For Heroes*. In this area we have many close connections with the Services and, as ringers, we want to do something to show that every village cares deeply about the lives scarred by current conflicts. 

From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

The recent closure of the Chestnut Horse at Great Finborough, which we all hope will be temporary, and the news of the departure of Rev Trudy Gray for Northumberland are instances of when something that seems permanent comes to a stop. We wish those involved with our pub. Well as we do Trudy in her ministry in the north. Nevertheless there is an element of sadness and sense that without them somehow our communal life is diminished. As far as Trudy is concerned her loss will be felt in all our villages especially with children's work. It will be even more keenly felt in the community of Finborough itself.

Many of these closures and departures are foreseeable by those who wish to look; others are not. These are some of the minor storms that affect all our lives – illness, sudden death, unemployment are much harder to bear, let alone complete catastrophes such as has afflicted the Haitian people.

So then the 'ship of life' on which we all sail is rocked by forces within and without us. How we deal with them depends to a large extent on personality and faith. Sometimes we struggle to 'keep an even keel' but reminded recently of the Gospel story when Jesus stilled the storm (Luke 8.22-25), he did not rebuke the disciples for being 'rocky' or asking for support. He dealt with their fear and simply asked them 'Where is your faith?'

There are people we too can ask for help –there is no shame...The same question comes to us as we look to our future, individually, as a group of churches, local communities and in terms of local government (newly reignited). There is nothing new under the sun 'though it frequently seems otherwise. Many people with little or no faith believe that ultimately all things work for good. But the faithful Christian actively engages in the work of the Kingdom of God believing that to be the ultimate good. The Christian believes that God holds us all in the palm of his hand and that he is working his purposes out through all of us – frail earthen vessels though we maybe.

The boat may rock and tip – but our corporate, communal and individual life goes on and on. Let us hold onto what is good and positive and encouraging and do what we can to give it support keeping faith in each other and in our God for a brighter future for us all.

And as I write I hear of the commencement of work on the boarded up window at St Andrews Church and exciting plans for the renovation of the Community Centre and Church Room in Onehouse. Transformation continues.
