

Only if a majority of votes in each district is in favour will we ask the Boundary Commission to begin the preparations for a new council to be formed in May 2013. # The Forge Caravan Site

I requested an explanation of what the 12 April hearing is about and has been informed that:

The Inquiry is not against a refusal of a planning application seeking permission for the land to be used as a general caravan site, but is against the refusal of the Council to issue a Lawful Use Development Certificate, dated 20/8/10. The application sought confirmation that the land can be lawfully used in future as a caravan site not restricted to occupation by the gypsy community. The MSDC position is that when an Inspector allowed an appeal in 1982 against an enforcement notice requiring the land to stop being then used as a caravan site he allowed it on the special case that it was at that time being used as a gypsy site.

Thus MSDC regard the lawful use to be a gypsy community occupation site, as per that appeal outcome, and not a general caravan site. Hence the LUD certificate application was refused on that basis. Counsel for both sides are appearing at the Inquiry to argue the point of what the 1982 appeal lawfully decided. In the particular circumstances, it is unlikely the Inquiry Inspector will wish to hear from other parties on anything to do with the merits of the caravan site, although he/she will review all written submissions on the case'.

Suffolk communities are invited to have their say on the future of the county's libraries with the launch of a new consultation inviting innovative approaches to running the library service of the future. Due to reductions in government funding, the library service needs to cost the county council at least 30% less within three years. This consultation began on 18 January 2011 and ends on Saturday 30 April 2011. It aims to encourage community and voluntary groups, businesses, local councils and individuals across Suffolk to have their say about ways to run their local library differently and at reduced cost. All responses will be considered in full and will shape recommendations to the Council's Cabinet when it meets in July 2011. Have your say at:

# **Home to school transport consultation 2011**

This consultation has been produced to give students, parents and other people the opportunity to comment on the council's proposals for changes to home-to-school transport.

Suffolk County Council is faced with having to make significant savings. Whilst the majority of the transport budget funds students who are eligible in law for free transport to school the council also makes arrangements for other students at its own discretion. It is in this area that the council is proposing a number of changes to make savings.

The consultation is split into four parts and covers proposed changes to:

- Post-16 transport arrangements
- Transport for children who need special arrangements
- Roman Catholic transport arrangements
- Discretionary transport arrangements

The consultation lasts until Friday 25 March 2011. ### **Marie Curie and Swimathon 2011**

I'm Alexandra, and with my partner James and our baby Joseph, moved into the village last October. We are renting a barn down Valley Lane and am loving the rural village life having moved from Surrey. I love the newsletter and must say it is a Godsend to new arrivals to get a sense of what is happening in the village.

I have decided to take the plunge and have entered Swimathon 2011. This is the world's biggest fundraising swim and this year Marie Curie Cancer Care is the chosen charity. For those unfamiliar with this charity, Marie Curie nurses care for and support people with cancer and other terminal illnesses, in the comfort of their own home.

As a relatively strong swimmer, I have decided to set myself the ultimate challenge and will be doing the 5km individual distance swim. It is 200 lengths of a 25 metre pool and I'm aiming to do it in around 180 minutes with a couple of small water breaks. Currently training hard, I can now swim 70 lengths non-stop and I'm building up my stamina all the time with an average of 3 training sessions per week.

My partner lost his dear mother, Ruth Marion Bourne, to cancer and I lost my grandfather, Harry Howlett, as well as too many dear family and friends to this unforgiving disease over the years. Therefore with my love of the sport and a cause close to my heart, I thought it was fitting that I should take the plunge! ......Excuse the pun.

On Saturday 9 April at Mid Suffolk Leisure Centre in Stowmarket, I shall be starting my race against the clock at 18.00 hours. 
