

#### **News from the Parish Council**

At the February meeting discussion and decisions included:

#### Post Office

Since the January meeting I have met with Post Office Ltd and impressed on their representative the need for an alternative site to be identified as soon as possible.

Support was sought from the Parish Council for the intention to site a Post Office within a new service The Chestnut Horse landlords aim to develop. The service hopes to include a farm shop and longer opening hours, providing a community amenity and employment for local people. Funding is being sought for the proposal from 'Pub is the Hub' and the Parish Council agreed to positively support the plan to incorporate a Post Office and to participate in a pre-application site meeting with MSDC at the pub. It was noted David Ruffley MP had written to the Parish Council about his concern that the Post Office had closed.

#### **Pettiward Hall**

Mary Preece reported on her comprehensive review of the ownership and governance of the asset that is the Pettiward Hall. It was noted that it is necessary to have a management committee. It was resolved to create a Pettiward Hall working group to include Cllrs Preece, Turner, Vendittelli and Nurton. The working group will make recommendations to the Parish Council as soon as is practicable. Terms of reference for the group will be drafted.

#### **Queens Diamond Jubilee**

The Parish Council resolved to set up an event planning group. The village celebration will take place on Tuesday 5 June 2012 with details to be confirmed.

#### Ravenscroft Development Amenity Land

It was agreed that the transfer of the area from Gipping Homes would need to be done first in order to remove the issue of access to the Woodpecker Hill area that was stalling the transfer of this land. The next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 5 March. The Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Meeting of the Council will be on Wednesday 9 May. You are welcome to attend. **Norman Vendittelli**

#### News from the Village School Statutory Inspection of Anglican Schools Report

I am delighted to be able to report the outcome of the School's inspection in January. As a Voluntary Controlled Church of England School, the inspection focuses on 3 key areas and judges these areas using the same terms as OFSTED Inspectors. The areas are:

- How well the school, through its distinctive Christian character, meets the needs of all pupils
- What the impact of collective worship is on the school community
- How effective is the leadership and management of the school as a church school.

The school has been judged to be 'Outstanding' by the SIAS Inspector.

#### Two Tier Education

It was agreed recently by the Cabinet of Suffolk County Council to allocate £5.5M to enabling the move from three tier education to two tier education in the Stowmarket pyramid that includes Great Finborough by 2015.

#### **Gymnastics**

As part of their PE curriculum work this term, Year 4 children will be covering a unit of work on Gymnastics. They are using the studio room at the Leisure Centre as this provides sufficient space to enable the children to develop their skills fully. During these sessions the children will also work towards national gymnastic awards.

#### **Mothering Sunday Service**

The School's children and parents will be attending the service at St Mary's Buxhall on Sunday 18 March 2012. See the services page at the back of the newsletter for details.

#### Climbing Club

Following the success of the first round of climbing sessions, a second group of Year  $\pounds$  and 4 children has been offered the chance to participate in this popular club.



#### St Andrew's Church is at Risk

At a recent Church meeting new Parochial Church Council (PCC) Treasurer, Andrew Robinson, reported that the St Andrew's cash reserves are now so low that current commitments cannot be met. Annual outgoings are about £15,500 and income might be around £11,250. In addition the latest survey of the Church building shows urgent repairs outstanding at a cost of around £16,000. The Church is struggling to meet basic health and safety standards and windows are boarded up for want of replacement.

The Church Council's AGM is on 18 April to which everyone is invited to discuss what can be done to save this village asset with its' iconic Spire. In the meantime a Help Group has been formed to offer assistance to the PCC. If you are qualified to certify electrical systems or check the health of trees, the church needs YOU. Please contact Raymond Zala at the Old Rectory on 613334.

There is a well founded view that the church is a fine building. Only five years ago the village obtained a National Lottery grant for a large sum of money to make the Church Spire safe. Unfortunately that has not stopped the need to maintain the building, nor halted the fall in income from the church community.

St Andrew's needs a fresh injection of enthusiasm, energy and cash. If the village wants the Church to stay an active focus of village life, more people are needed to get help and get involved with cleaning, maintenance, and fund raising. Of course, more churchgoers is also our mission. Your village church needs YOU now! What can you offer?

#### 2012 celebrates The 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Book of Common Prayer



I hope that we will be able to celebrate this remarkable part of our English heritage just as we did for the King James Bible last year. It is a survivor. By the 1970s it looked as if it might be lost forever; caught up in the spirit of the age of sweeping away all that seemed

'irrelevant'. This was both because of its language and its emphasis on people's fallen nature and need for grace.

It is not popular with some Christians and has been displaced in many churches by more modern rites but it provides services that have a resonance with many people that modern liturgies cannot emulate. The phrases: 'ashes to ashes, dust to dust,' and 'to love and to cherish' have come into our language and become part of our culture.



The sheer sense of history: from father to son, from mother to daughter - being baptised, married and buried using the same words has given a sense of comfort and continuity to many.

For those interested can I refer vou to the website www.bcp350.org which provides a fascinating insight development, into its' translations worldwide and breadth. Alternatively I have a copy of the Prayer Book Societies celebratory booklet that I would be pleased to pass on. The churches of Harleston, Shelland and Buxhall have an

unbroken record of Prayer Book worship for 350 years. It is right to celebrate and this time I hope we shall do so at Harleston in the summer on a date to be announced.

Alain de Botton has written many books and essays concentrating largely on philosophy and its connection to everyday life. A couple of years ago I read his 'Status Anxiety', published in 2004, but I have yet to view his latest offering His new book, 'Religion for Atheists'.



Alain's contribution to the 'God or not' debate has been welcomed by many because it acknowledges that there are good things done by organised religion. He wonders if atheists can have some of the benefits without taking on all the trappings; including what he calls 'peculiar doctrines'. He believes, as do I, that the churches have much to teach about caring for each other, building community, overcoming feelings of inadequacy, respecting others, making relationships last, and more.

I believe that many agnostics, let alone atheists, do obtain some of the benefits. This is to be welcomed wholeheartedly by the community. Many people join in community activities organised by the churches without the need for faith or 'peculiar doctrines'. From lunch clubs to prison visiting, third world aid to pastoral care and youth clubs, churches do much good at little or no cost to society.

The couples to be married in our group of churches spent a Saturday recently considering their futures as a couple rather than the consuming detail of the wedding day. Concepts of forgiveness and generosity of spirit do us all good, and community events such as royal and national celebrations build society. They are part of church life. Our great architectural heritage in the shape of our buildings is the responsibility of local Christians; so is much art and music. In the main, local churches enjoy good support from their local communities; if only for the preservation and enhancement of their church as an 'icon' (symbol) in the community.

The church is often the place to which people turn at momentous times in their lives. There is no examination to pass before its support is offered. So the church is here for all and delights in it. Come and use it as generations have before you.

NHS charges for dental treatment apply to the care provided:

- Band 1 covers a check up, simple cleaning, oral cancer screening, preventative and dietary advice (£17)
- Band 2 is everything in Band1 plus any fillings, extractions and some denture adjustments (£47).
- Band 3 includes Bands 1 and 2 treatments and the cost of making new dentures (£204).
