

- No objection to the erection of a two storey dwelling and cart lodge following demolition of the existing dwelling at Valley Farm Bungalow, Valley Lane
- The Mid Suffolk DC and Babergh DC Joint Local Plan consultation document
- Complaints have been received regarding increased dog fouling on the High Road since the relocation of the dog bin adjacent to the bungalows. It was suggested that an additional bin may be required. Cllr Turner will contact MSDC in order to try to source one as before.

News from your District Councillor Planning Applications

My own experience, as well as the procedures at Mid Suffolk, shows that if you are considering a building project, pre-application advice and discussion often smooths the path and saves time and money. If you think you may need planning permission telephone 724500 and ask for the duty planning officer who will give advice by telephone or in person. If objections are anticipated a pre-application discussion on site may resolve these at the outset. Such a discussion will usually involve the applicant and agent/architect, a planning officer, a representative of the parish council and the district councillor (currently me).

Do you need advice?

We are fortunate to have an excellent Citizens Advice Bureaux in Stowmarket which is able to advise on a range of personal and financial problems. It is in Milton Road South, next to the Town Council (T: 676060) and at http://www.midsuffolkcab.org.uk/advice/. The Avenues Group specialises in advice and advocacy for people with disabilities and is based in Red Gables, Ipswich Road, Stowmarket (T: 672781) and at www.avenuesgroup.org.uk

Stowmarket Food Bank

More people are being referred to the local food bank and they are in need of more donations. There are collection points in local supermarkets, churches including St Andrew's, the Town Council offices, and the Community Centre in Hillside, Combs Ford. They need tinned and dried food, and toiletries.

Petition for 30mph zone on Finborough Road

This has been responded to in some detail, and it will eventually be considered by Suffolk County Council. The planning application for the Red Willows site, which gave rise to the petition, has been approved, with the Planning Committee agreeing to write to Suffolk County Council in support of the speed limit.

From the Rectory

I noted that Candlemas Day (2 February) was



indeed dry and bright so 'Winter may have another bite'. It did later that week. These old country sayings do have some sense in them but today with central heating, heated car seats and the like we can move seamlessly from one comfort zone to another. Not so our forebears and not for so many people in our world.

The shame and horror that some people continue to kill others or make their lives more difficult is

hard to comprehend. But in days gone by we in this land were not always kind to one another. The Patronal Festival at Shelland at the end of January had us with Bishop David remembering the murder of our King, for standing up for what his beliefs. Other Christians put him to death.

Christians have behaved abominably towards each other in the past which we do well to remember when condemning those of other faiths. And it is not just abominable behaviour. Sometimes just uncharitable, unloving actions and attitudes that reach into our lifetimes have caused much hurt. For example, the Workhouse system, its representative standing sentinel as it does high on Onehouse Hill. Thankfully, for many centuries we have not killed or maimed in the name of some creed or belief system, although we could have loved better...

It is right then , as Lent is here, that our churches are turning their attention with renewed vigour to helping others who still suffer. St Andrew's Coffee Mornings do this monthly and almost all our churches

are organising events as you can see to support and do God's work. Ebola, MacMillan and Christian Aid all feature. Will you come and help us?

My God does not call me to persecute others. My God calls me to encourage and support that which is good and I hope you feel able to support that work too through the church or otherwise. The church exists to be useful to its community and wider; to show love and care and concern. It does not exist for itself and its own interest groups. We want to show love breaking through as did God at Easter.

Keep a watch on your aquilegias. A new and lethal variety of downy mildew is decimating these staple cottage garden plants and there is no method of control or cure other than uprooting them and destruction by fire or in the council's composting. Your own compost heap does not reach a high enough temperature to do the job and so will spread the mildew through the rest of your

plants. This mildew has already been found in Essex as well as other counties throughout the UK so be aware!

The next meeting in the Pettiward Hall, on Thursday 12 March at 7.30pm will be a talk by Tim Fuller of the Plantsman's Preference on the subject of "Grasses".


