

As there was no Parish Council meeting in February, March's meeting saw a full agenda and was well attended by members of the public. At the adjournment for public participation the following points were raised:

- Bus Service problems with the size of buses and the amount of space available for village residents. Penny Otton has agreed to look into this.
- Dog Poo yet again village members were complaining about dog poo not being picked up by irresponsible dog owners. It was agreed to attempt to educate all about the dangers of Toxocariasis and also about the fines that can be awarded on completion of a successful prosecution. All village residents are asked to be vigilant and report any persons not cleaning up after their dog to the village council.
- Woodpecker Hill Concerns were expressed about the state
 of the pathway in woodpecker hill. The Council are aware of the
 problems highlighted and are in the process of getting quotes
 to get the ditches cleared which should alleviate a lot of the wet
 areas.

On completion of the public participation the Parish Council noted the planning decisions that have been approved by MSDC. The Clerks Finance report was approved and Internal Auditors for the Year ending 31 March 2017 approved.

The date and format of the Annual Parish meeting was discussed and approved. It will be held on 8 May, starting at 7.30pm in the downstairs room of Pettiward Hall. All members of the public are encouraged to attend.

Suffolk County Council Budget

This was agreed on 17 Feb. There was an amendment to put back the cut to the library service, to children's centres, highways maintenance, concessionary fare support and, hedge and verge cutting and post 16 travel which I was happy to support. After a long and bad tempered debate, this was defeated and the original budget agreed by a majority. This includes the 3% rise for social care.

Locality Budget

Agreed towards cost of additional road sign for Middlefield drive.

Extension to Footway, Forest Road

I have contacted David Fawcett once again to see if there has been any progress.

Ofsted Report on Special Educational Needs in Suffolk

The inspection showed significant weaknesses and requires action.

From the Rectory April 2017

Thank you to all those who responded to the Bishops invitation to meet them. I wish Onehouse Church had been bigger to accommodate. Certainly, the Young Farmers at the Shepherd and Dog on Wednesday night were surprised to engage with others just as used to wielding crooks as they are in different circumstances - but perhaps to the



same effect. It seems appropriate that they came to see us all in Lent because it runs into Easter which is the festival of Surprise if not shock. At its barest, a man died was buried and then was seen alive by his shocked followers. Many today cannot quite accept that, but they can and do acknowledge that because of that event a great number of good things have happened and continue to happen in the world. Christian Charity is not alone but it is very prominent both financially and socially. I have mentioned the Church ventures in Gt Finborough, Combs and Onehouse to alleviate Ionliness and isolation, perhaps the Church Coffee caravan in Buxhall will find traction now after a few months and its arrival at Harleston/Shelland do the same. Pettiward Hall Committee in Gt Finborough are doing their part too. The church most definitely does not have a monopoly on good will(!) Dare I suggest that care and concern for each other, whether identifiably from the Church is a Christian value embedded into our culture that was certainly not around in 1st Century Palestine and is wanting in many places in the world today.

It is still a shock to some that others care about their neighbours and the world but the root is the shock of Easter that God cared so much that his son had to die and God made the point by making him rise again. In our increasingly faithless society let's not forget, nor fail to teach the story of Easter and its implications for each of us. The Traditional and less Traditional services are all advertised. For those looking for something a bit different so is Lt Finborough's Easter Egg Hunt and procession, Combs Messy Church on Good Friday will build an outdoor garden and on Holy Saturday we have a very special service/party at 5pm for all. Please join us as we remember and celebrate the real meaning.
