

#### **News from the Parish Council**

At the meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 14 March the following items were discussed and decisions made:

- Planning No new applications to consider, decisions noted.
- · Reports from County and District Councillors.
- Allotment hedge Agreed to height reduction.
- Planting of tree by car park Agreed.
- Village newsletter Consultation on electronic version.
- Valley Lane sports pitch Consultation on future usage.
- New local business Agreed 2 month free advertising.
- Queens 90<sup>th</sup> birthday Agreed to sponsor event.
- Dog fouling Agreed to continue to actively pursue offenders.

#### **Great Finborough - Community Preparedness**

Although Suffolk County Council has responsibilities for snow clearance and gritting alongside the Highways Agency, they do not have unlimited resources and are unable to provide clearance of snow on every pavement or road in Suffolk. The County Council's position is that sensible self-help is to be encouraged.

Great Finborough Parish Council arranges for the provision of Salt Grit piles and boxes around the village and we rely on the generosity of those residents who spread the grit when necessary for the benefit of others. There is however a public misconception that getting involved with spreading grit and snow clearance can leave individuals accountable if someone slips on an area they have cleared. However, if volunteers have registered with their Parish Council they will be covered under County Council insurance

We need to keep a list of volunteers, so if you would be happy to spread salt grit from the piles provided at times when the roads are icy, please let me know. I can add you to my register and you will be covered under Suffolk County Council insurance scheme.

## **News From Your County Councillor BUDGET**

As expected the county council has agreed the level of council tax on 11 February. With a recommendation to have a 2% increase to cover cost of increase in adult social care. This is equal to a rise of £22.50 for a band D. There remains a freeze on general council tax. There is also proposal for reducing the funds to the Martlesham Park and Ride which could result it in it's closure.

#### **COMMUNITY BUS SERVICE**

The new contracts have been agreed. The new service for Mid Suffolk area is to be run by ASPIRE.

#### SCHOOLS ADMISSIONS

The applications for school admission for the coming year is now closed. Across the county 97.7% received an offer on 1 of 3 of their preferred schools. The council agreed at cabinet to not give preference to school staff (this is all staff not just teachers).

#### **FOSTER CARERS**

There is to be another campaign to get more foster carers in Suffolk.

#### **NEW CHARGES AT RE-CYCLING CENTRES**

There is to be new charges for some building materials.

#### SPEED LIMIT PANEL

On Monday 14 March I will be speaking to get the speed limit on Finborough road upgraded to 30mph. The officer is recommending only to 40mph. I may have to accept that if that is the best that can be achieved.

**Update** – It has now been agreed that the speed limit on Finborough Road from Stowmarket to the Shepherd and Dog will be reduced to 40mph.

#### News from your District Councillor Tree Planting

Special news and thanks this month to everyone who has donated trees over the last few years. With half a dozen helpers I was able to plant 65 native trees at the Museum of East Anglian Life recently. A few of these replaced ash trees I helped to plant a few years ago but which were affected by disease. The remainder will grow into a hedge to shelter the museum's pigs at the bottom of the field near the chapel. Thanks also for the donation of tree guards and stakes which will keep the young saplings safe from rabbits and deer. More trees in pots will be welcome this spring, so keep a look out when digging over the vegetable plot.

#### **East Anglian Devolution?**

Since last autumn representatives of all the councils in the region have been meeting Government to discuss possible devolution of some government powers to Combined Authorities, for example trunk roads, flooding, and skills and apprenticeships. In September the Government considered a proposal by the 7 districts of Suffolk, then extended the negotiation to the councils of Norfolk, and then in the New Year announced that Cambridgeshire should also be included (27 councils in all). This negotiation has remained behind closed doors while repeatedly changing tack at Government insistence. By the time of publication, a final deal may have been announced but I and the vast majority of other councillors have not been asked our views on the matter. If you would like to know more, please ask and I'll provide as full a briefing as I can of this complex situation, and also my own views on the subject should you wish to hear them! Alternatively, check out the local press for updates.

#### From the Rectory

The Gospel Reading for Sunday 13 March (John 12.1-8) records the time when Mary Magdalene anointed Jesus' feet with an expensive oil. Judas, the treasurer to the group, is reported as suggesting that it was a terrible waste and that the money could have been better used.



There we have the dichotomy which most of us face in daily life; undoubtedly we do as churches, and certainly we do as a nation. What someone sees as waste is another persons' benefit.

Whatever our views, the point here is that sometimes we all need to think seriously about the use of our time and money. Doing something that will improve the lot of others or even another, bringing reconciliation, putting back together that which is broken – or even more likely, improve that which already exists, is not waste. Not everything can be reduced to a financial balance sheet in this world – where increasingly it seems that the price of everything is known but not the value.

We are in the season of Easter. Good Friday showed us what some thought of the values of Christ and the Kingdom he came to show. Easter Day brought new life and hope but was only enabled by the 'wasting' of one man's life. The fact he rose from the waste and lived confirms for many the truth of what he stood for.

I wonder if all too often we are caught up in the mind-set that to do something extra for others or even within our families and friends is a waste because it doesn't accord with the world's mind-set?

#### **Torticas De Navidad (Cuban Cookies)**

This recipe was sent over by Cuban Women for the Women's World Day of Prayer. Easy to make and very tasty.

Makes 36 cookies ( I used a cup which held 10 fluid ounces)
1 cup butter, 1.25 cups sugar, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 2.5
cups self raising flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 0.5 teaspoon

bicarbonate of soda, 2 cups corn flakes lightly crushes into smaller pieces, NOT crumbs, 1 cup chopped nuts (do not use if there is a possibility of allergies) 1 cup raisins or sultanas, 1 cup glace cherries.

Preheat oven to 190degC/Mark 5, line a baking sheet with parchment.

Cut 18 of the cherries in half and set aside. Chop the remainder.

Cream the butter and sugar together in a small bowl (with wooden spoon or electric mixer)

Gradually add the eggs and vanilla.

Sift together the flour, baking powder and bicarb.

Add these dry ingredients to the creamed sugar and mix well.

Gently fold in the nuts, raisins and chopped cherries.

Take a teaspoon of dough and roll it in the cornflakes.

Place the cookies on a baking tray (I put 12 on a tray) place a cherry half in the centre of each cookie.

Bake for 14 minutes, (depending on how your oven cooks, they all vary) then cool on a rack.




#### **Finborough Flyers**

#### Fraud Alert!

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau is warning people to beware of fraudsters who turn up on your doorstep and ask for your signature. The Proactive Intelligence Team debriefs convicted offenders to identify emerging fraud trends and has found that your signature is one part of a puzzle that the fraudsters are putting together. Your signature could be the final piece - once they get hold of it they can drain your bank account or commit identity crime.

A convicted fraudster who was recently interviewed said: "If we want to get someone's signature it's really easy. All we do is put on a fluorescent coat or vest, knock on the door and ask the person to sign for a letter or a flyer. They don't need signing for, but nobody ever questions why and we don't hang around for a chat! Once we have the signature we can make changes on their bank accounts and authorise fraudulent money transfers."

#### How to protect yourself

Not expecting a delivery? Be suspicious.

Question what you are signing for and look for official identification. If you do sign, just print your name.

Check your bank and financial statements carefully and report anything suspicious to the bank or financial service provider concerned.

Criminals commit different frauds depending on the type of the personal information they manage to steal. Your identity is a precious commodity; you should take every precaution to ensure that it isn't abused or stolen. If you believe that you have been a victim of fraud, you can report it online at www.actionfraud.police.uk/report\_fraud or by telephone on 0300 123 2040.

#### Suffolk Walking Festival 14 May - 5 June 2016

The 2016 Suffolk Walking Festival kicks off on Saturday 14 May and continues for three weeks until Sunday 5 June. The varied programme of 77 themed walks across the county range in length from a gentle stroll of one mile, to a challenging 60 miles in 24 hours and will take place along Suffolk's glorious coast, through scenic, gently undulating countryside and around our medieval towns and villages.

The annual walking festival is a partnership project supported by all of Suffolk's local authorities and is spearheaded by the Discover Suffolk project at Suffolk County Council. This year's festival launch, which is sponsored by Suffolk Coastal District Council, takes place at RSPB Minsmere on the Suffolk coast. The event will also mark the launch of Suffolk's Year of Walking, which starts in May 2016 and ends in May 2017.

There are three lots of challenge walks planned, which have been sponsored by the Suffolk Coast & Heaths Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). The Mega Challenge, for the ultra fit, is a walk which will be undertaken over a 24 hour period, covering 60 miles from Lowestoft to Felixstowe. The Classic Challenge, a firm favourite among regular festival goers, is made up of five walks of between 11 and 14 miles each. As with The Mega Challenge, the route goes from Lowestoft to Felixstowe, but will be at a rather more sedate pace and spread over five days. The Mini Challenge consists of three walks of around nine miles each: Oulton Broad to Beccles, the 'Trimley Loop' and a walk ending with refreshments at the National Trust's Sutton Hoo, near Woodbridge.

Other walks include two stress-relieving mindfulness walks; a 'prambling' walk for parents with prams; photography, birdwatching and Pilates walks; a gentle stroll for sufferers of dementia and their carers, a walk which includes views of early marsh orchids, a speed-dating ramble and the ever-popular 'Horrible History For Families' in Ipswich.

Some include a cream tea or other refreshments and all are an informal and sociable way to explore the county, meet like-minded people and to indulge in a leisure activity which benefits both body and soul.




