

### **News from the Parish Council**

**Speedwatch – CAN YOU HELP** – We are now in a position to start the Speedwatch scheme again, we have a couple of volunteers who together with some of our councillors have kindly agreed to give some time to help reduce the speeds of traffic through the village. We really do need to see a few more new volunteers come forward to help make sure that the scheme is truly effective now that we have it back up and running. We desperately need people on the ground in a HI VIS so if you think you could help by giving up a couple of hours a month then please contact me or any of your councilors.

The Community Speed Watch initiative allows members of the community to address the issue of speeding by becoming actively involved in road safety, monitoring speeds at safe locations with speed detection equipment. It addresses the problem of speeding through the joint work of the police, local community, parish councils and other partners.

### The aim is not to catch as many speeding drivers as possible but to reduce speed in areas of concern.

Community Speed Watch informs drivers that excessive speed is socially unacceptable and helps to re-educate drivers about the dangers of speeding while addressing concerns from local residents about cars speeding through their neighbourhoods. Police forces across the country implementing the initiative can show a reduction in overall average speeds, and a significant reduction in drivers travelling well above the speed limit, which highlights the benefits of the scheme. Please help if you can.

**Dog poo** - Again a reminder — Complaint about dog poo is one of the most common cause of concern raised to the parish council. It is every dog owner's duty to clean up after his or her dog and it is no defence to claim ignorance of your dog's actions. Dog mess is a nuisance, at the least it can cover shoes and clothes and at worst contact with canine excrement can lead to blindness due to a worm carried by dogs called "Toxocara Canis".

Toxocara canis is a roundworm found in dogs. Roundworm eggs are found in dog mess, which can easily be picked up by young children. This causes stomach upsets, sore throats, asthma and in rare cases blindness. The eggs can remain active in the soil for many years, long after the dog mess has weathered away.

Dog owners **please** clean up after your dog in public places – If your dog fouls in a public place, you must clean up the mess under the Dog Act 1996. Always carry a poop scoop or a bag to carry the mess to a dog bin. There are several provided by the parish council around the village. If there isn't a dog mess bin on your route, take it home and dispose of it there. Failure to clean up after your dog can mean anything from the issue of a fixed penalty ticket of £50 to prosecution and a fine of up to £1,000.

If you see this offence happening **REPORT IT**. You can report dog fouling that isn't cleaned up to your local council, Call 0845 606 6067 or email <a href="mailto:customerservices@csduk.com">customerservices@csduk.com</a> If possible, give details such as the name and address of the offender or, if not, a good description of them and their dog.

We can all help to make this disgusting problem better.

### **UPDATE**

Action is currently being taken against a village resident for persistent failure to clean up after their dog.

All residents are welcome to attend Parish Council meetings where a time is set-aside at the beginning to give you the opportunity to speak to the council on any matter relating to the village. Please come along and raise any issues of concern, make a statement about local matters or draw issues to council's attention. Each meeting commences promptly at 7.30pm unless otherwise stated. All meetings are advertised on the village notice board with a copy of the agenda. District Councillor John Matthissen and County Councillor Penny Otton attend meetings regularly so if you have any issues you think they could help with as part of their District and County responsibilities don't hesitate to come along and question them, they would be pleased to meet you.

### From the Rectory

At Gt Finborough on Easter Eve as daylight mixes with night we shall gather and start a new fire from which we shall ignite our Paschal candle. Then we shall all celebrate in church with an act of worship including the renewal of our Baptismal vows, refreshments and an Easter Egg



Hunt. All are welcome at 4pm as we remember the New Life of the resurrected Jesus on Easter Day.

We have been deluged with Baptisms recently –3 at Little Finborough in just over a month and goodness knows how many booked in at Combs, even Harleston has one in July and I make a point of re-lighting the Easter Candle and passing that light to the individuals' Baptismal candle. I always explain the Christian concept of 'The Light of Christ'. As I do, I register strongly that Christians are not necessarily bringing God's Light into an entirely dark world or to people who have no concept of it. Arguably neither did Christ himself. We live in a world of shades of grey.

The fact that there were daffodils out in December and many other flowers seemed not to know they were supposed to be saving their blooms until the spring, makes the point. We all know that it was the unusually warm weather that caused the early flowering but it did seem 'wrong'. When we were young, winters were WINTERS and summers were SUMMERS. Many of us remember '76. Fewer will remember '63. Amidst the dark of this winter there are blooms, we don't remember it being like that.

Amidst darkness there is light and amidst injustice there is truth. Remember Maximilian Kolbe the priest who gave his life for another in Auchwitz? Governor Pilate asked at Jesus' trial, 'What is truth?' No black or white for him. It has been said 'Easter says you can put truth in the grave but it won't stay there'.

At Easter Christians especially mark the fact the fact that they can put behind them that which is wrong - having struggled to discern throughout Lent - and reach out to that which is good. Of course that is done each Sunday but it has particular resonance at Easter. The man they put in the grave got out because he was truth and he brought light. Will each of us make a new start this Easter to try and do something for others, to be better, to show more support for those in need – to follow Christs Light? That's not to say good things haven't been done in the past but it might be to say we will live a' *lighter'* or 'newer' life.

You will find a warm welcome in any of the churches at Easter and all will have a special celebration associated with the bringing in of the Light of Christ.

I hope there will be good support for a Church sponsored new venture in Buxhall to try and combat the obvious loneliness in so many of our communities as we see the arrival of the Coffee Caravan on Monday 14 March at 2pm at the Village Hall. Hopefully it will turn into a regular Community event for all. I also hope you will be able to support the Lent Lunches.

### **Church Maintenance**

There is a lot of building work happening in our Churches at present and we are certainly keeping the Diocesan Faculty (Planning) System busy let alone ourselves with the monumental task of maintaining and improving these beautiful buildings in our midst. If you can help in any way, please speak to me. The administration task alone is enormous. In my long experience the most challenging has always been St Andrews Great Finborough because of the sheer quality and detail of the original workmanship, now at the end of its life, coupled with a general antipathy to Victoriana throughout most of the last century. The roof and drainage repair work is due to start shortly and thank you to those who have been generous to the church Council, who are all volunteers and really do their best to maintain this treasure.

Combs should be completely repaired by the autumn and up to A1 condition thanks to remarkable support from so many and now the PCC has approved tentative plans to get the Bells ringing for the Centenary of the end of WW1. Many of us think that is a fitting tribute to our heritage but more particularly to those who gave their lives.

Shelland and Harleston have severe problems with their turrets and in Little Finborough, a rotten timber in the west wall is causing great concern. Buxhall forges ahead with plans for glass exterior doors to reduce the drafts and perhaps a new internal glass wall to the tower arch. Onehouse is very proud of its wonderful plans for virtually rebuilding Trinity Hall.

John has been an invaluable member of this community for 30 years. achievements are numerous. He established Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in the mid 1990's and has remained as coordinator. A long standing member of the Garden Club, he has been Chairman for the last 10 years. Together with his committee, he has inspired a flourishing organisation which as well as providing informative and well attended monthly meetings also organises the village Open Gardens Day which raises large sums for local charities. As an additional money raiser for charity, he organises the ordering and delivery of wild bird seed within the community. Over the last decade approximately £18,000 has been donated to good causes including EACH, St Andrew's church, the village primary school, Pettiward Hall and the allotment association, to name but a few.

He was to the fore in the recent creation of the village allotments and has also spent much of his time in recent years improving and maintaining the facilities within Pettiward Hall. He was the instigator in creating the daffodil display which bursts forth every Spring throughout the village and has just sourced and installed a new picnic table and bench around the village green areas.

John is always willing and able to help out any organisation or individual within the community whether by prior planning or in a crisis. He never asks for thanks or praise but he could be said to be worthy of the title 'Mr Great Finborough' but his modesty would lead him to be embarrassed by such praise.

### **Finborough School**

There were 31 comments on the planning application by the time a number of residents attended the Planning Committee meeting on 3 February at which it was decided by Mid Suffolk District Council that up to 30 commercial events per year can take place in the first floor of the sports hall but that amplified music must have the volume controlled by a sound limiting device, and that it must stop at 23.30 hours on Saturdays and Sundays and at 22.30 hours on the other days. Fireworks must not be used and there cannot be more than one event with music per week. Cars must be parked in accordance with the original planning consent for the building of the hall.

Concern was expressed by councillors about the potential impact on the boarding pupils at the school as well as near neighbours. The parish council's opposition to the application was noted, as was the open investigation into whether the building was built too high and contrary to the planning consent. Most importantly, in a decision the committee members described as 'finely balanced', approval was given only for 3 years to encourage the potential nuisance to the village community to be properly managed by Mr Sinclair who explained that the profit from the events is needed to improve the financial viability of the School.
