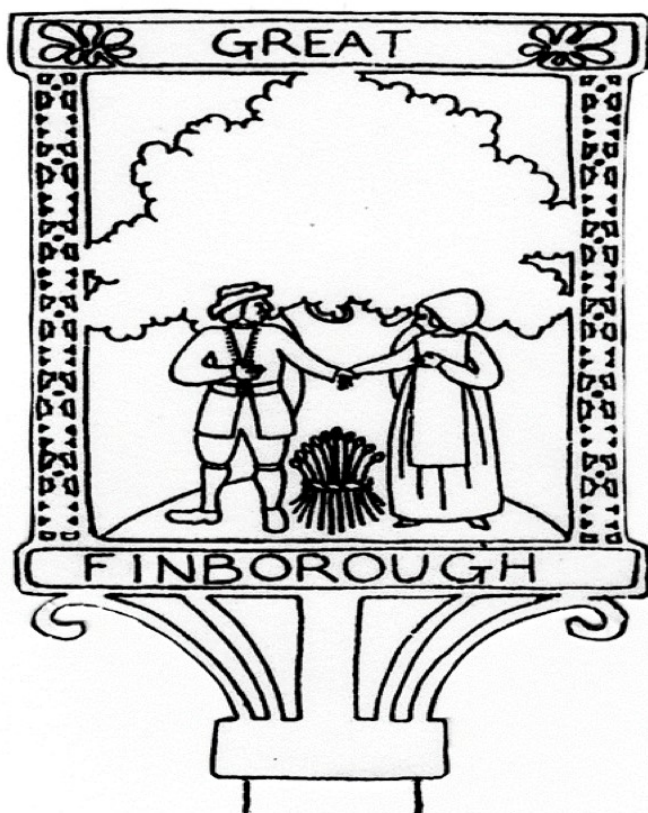

## **Great Finborough Parish Council**

The March meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 11 of the month at 7.30pm. The following matters were discussed and noted;

District Councillors report - Cllr Matthissen's report was received. It was noted that the planning officer for the proposed development on land in front of Buxhall Lodge had decided that the applicant needed to revise certain parts of the proposal prior to it being considered by committee.

County Councillors report - Cllr Otten's report was received. It was noted that with regards to school transport, families entitled to receive free school travel must now opt-in. Public participation - A group of residents from Coombs Lane voiced their concerns over traffic volume and speeds along the road. Following discussions, it was agreed that the Parish Clerk would ask Highways if it was possible for a traffic count to be carried out at the Great Finborough end of the road.

Footpaths - Discussions were had over the proposal to produce a footpath map of our Parish. It was generally agreed that this would be a good idea and that more research was needed into production costs and whether any village residents might have the necessary skills to help with production.

Representing Onehouse, Great Finborough, Buxhall, Harleston and Shelland

### **Elections and Boundary Changes**

This will be my last village news report before the local elections due on the 2 May. Although I will be standing for re-election to represent the villages, the outcome is in your hands so I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has helped, raised issues or otherwise worked with me to try and do our best for our communities.

### **Disabled Facilities Grants**

The Council provides help to owners, private renters and council tenants where adaptations are needed due to illness or disability. The process for assessing and carrying out such work has for several years been far too slow and, following recommendations of Scrutiny Committee and a decision by Cabinet, should now be much quicker for straightforward work. ### **Dangerous Bridge**

Thanks to the local resident who has approached me regarding the bridge at the bottom of the hill from Finborough towards Stowmarket and the possibility of priority signing similar to that at Burford Bridge. This has been pursued previously with the County Council without success, however following discussion with our County Councillor, Penny Otton, and the support of Finborough Parish Council we will be pursuing the matter once again. Many of you will know that very many minor collisions take place there, and I have collected the evidence during several village litter picks. We may need a petition in support of this and I would welcome emails and phone calls from anyone willing to help.

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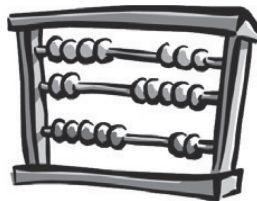
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## From the Rectory April 2019

jumped – as it were – and both have landed well. Easter calls us to do the same, because it can help us become the people we are meant to be and give us that contentment for which we surely yearn

### **First Steps, Brancaster** *Malcolm Guite*

This is the day to leave the dark behind you  
Take the adventure, step beyond the hearth,  
Shake off at last the shackles that confined you,  
And find the courage for the forward path.  
You yearned for freedom through the long night watches,  
The day has come and you are free to choose,  
Now is your time and season.  
Companioned still by your familiar crutches,  
And leaning on the props you hope to lose,  
You step outside and widen your horizon.

After the dimly burning wick of winter  
That seemed to dull and darken everything  
The April sun shines clear beyond your shelter  
And clean as sight itself. The reed-birds sing,  
As heaven reaches down to touch the earth

### **Rev Arlene Cruickshanks**

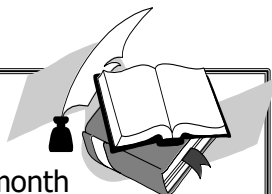
