#### **Great Finborough Parish Council**

The March meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 9 of the month at 7.30pm. The following matters were discussed and noted:

Woodpecker Hill Wood – Volunteers have come forward to work on clearing dead wood caused by Ash die back. They are planning on planting up more area of the wood and carrying out general maintenance. Anyone who could spare some time to help out with this and other maintenance jobs would be very welcome. See article in this magazine.

We are still looking for a Neighbourhood watch coordinator, any takers please contact Councillor Spencer.

Combs Lane Flooding – Some work has ben carried out by SCC but he pipes under the road are still blocked and need clearing to allow the water to drain away. Councillors Otton and Matthissen to chase Highways.

Parking on the High Road – Suffolk Police PCSO feedback that they have spoken with car owners. The issue has improved and will be continued to be monitored.

Charity donations were awarded to Age UK Suffolk, Home Start Suffolk and The Mix, Stowmarket.

Discussions took place around what the PC should / could do regarding Covid 19. It was agreed at the time of the meeting that National advice should be followed directing people to the Government, WHO and NHS websites for information. It was also agreed that residents should be encouraged to get to know their neighbours better and help out where they are able to do so.

The next meeting is programmed for Monday 6 April at 7.30pm in Pettiward Hall.

#### **News from your District Councillor - John Matthissen**

#### Coronavirus

We are all hearing lots about the virus with the situation changing day by day. All our public services, including the District Council, will be increasingly struggling due to staff absence, and Mid Suffolk is currently preparing to maintain at least basic services, while pointing people to the most recent official guidance. This can been found on the government website: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-the-public">https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-the-public</a>, covering areas such as managing the spread of the virus, travelling, and self-isolation.

The support of family, neighbours and local communities becomes increasingly important as we prepare in case infection becomes widespread. It is worth asking ourselves — *Do we know our neighbours? Do we have each other's telephone numbers? Am I able to help, or do I know who I might ask for help should I need it, with ordering groceries, collecting prescriptions etc?* This card is being widely used across the county and might be useful to pop through neighbours' doors.

#### Climate emergency – what else can we do?

This is my third contribution of practical suggestions to reduce our impact on the planet through gradual changes. This month, a look at recycling.

There is a clear saving of energy in recycling **metal** and **glass**, as far more energy is needed to produce them from newly mined minerals. Top of the list are **aluminium cans**, and electrical items which contain copper and brass. Paper and card should be recycled if clean, including **newspapers**, and the benefit comes from the reduced need to fell trees, rather than saved energy. Most plastics can be recycled, but there are a limited number of ways to re-use the resulting materials. It's to be welcomed that single-use plastic is increasingly seen as best avoided, with lots of pressure on supermarkets to change their packaging for example, although this is proving a very gradual process. The best aim is to use less plastic wherever we can and then recycle what is unavoidable. Larger items, such as garden chairs, laundry baskets, plant pots and children's toys can go the Household Recycling Centre (the dump) on the edge of Stowmarket. They can also take in all sorts of electrical equipment, wooden furniture, **spent oil**, **batteries** and more. Again, perhaps those of us with cars can consider helping out neighbours who aren't able to travel to this facility?

Of course, the main responsibility to tackle climate overheating lies with those with power to alter things at a national level and beyond. However, all our small acts locally – including changes to food, travel, energy, or recycling - do help to make a difference.





#### **Concessionary Bus Passes**

With bus services to Great Finborough ending on 31 March, those with concessionary bus passes are eligible to apply for travel vouchers instead. In exchange you will receive £100 worth of vouchers for the year which will be accepted by local taxi firms to part pay fares.
