The Parish council election was uncontested as there were only 3 nominees but hopefully we can co-opt some willing village resident volunteers to make up the other 4 seats.

Lastly, I would like to say a big thank you to the outgoing Parish Councillors for all their hard work over the last 4 years, especially Peter Turner, whose drive and commitment has resulted in many improvements to village life and the appearance of our village surroundings. Great Finborough Parish Council

The April meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 8th of the month at 7.30pm. The following matters were discussed and noted; Thanks were expressed to residents who helped clarify the route of FP23/FP22 with councillors enjoying perusal of the old maps brought along. It was noted that the landowner will need to be asked to clearly mark the cross field path.

It was confirmed that our VAS and our Speedwatch scheme cannot be operated outside a 30mph limit so is not suitable to be deployed in Combs Lane. A traffic survey has been requested of SCC Highways and details of any data from previous traffic surveys has been sought.

The white Iveco van abandoned in the Middlefield Drive car park has been reported to MSDC who will arrange tracing the owner and its removal.

SCC Highways and Legal Services have been chased regarding the illegal access to no 24 The Chestnuts via High Road.

Resident concerns raised regarding the car park at Middlefield Road were highlighted; the white line bays are thought to be sufficiently marked out at this time and maintenance of bushes at the entrance is part of the current open space contract and has now been carried out. It was Resolved to submit the following comments to MSDC for applications; DC/19/01162 Use of land for the provision of additional car parking, netball courts, football pitch and associated external lighting - Finborough School, The Hall - "Great Finborough Parish Council has NO OBJECTION to this application based on the information available"

Assets of Community Value - It was resolved to re apply for listing for The Chestnut Horse.

Thanks were extended to outgoing Councillors Turner, Nurton and Gemmell for their commitment and service to the Parish Council with regret expressed that they would not be standing for election on 2nd May.

The date of the Annual village meeting was set for the 14 May. Next Parish meeting 13 May, upstairs room Pettiward Hall, all welcome.

Parish Councillors will be there, plus your District & County Cllrs, however they are mainly there to listen and take note! The real purpose of the meeting is to enable residents to have your say on anything you consider is important to the people of Great Finborough parish.

As long as is needed but usually no more than an hour or so - but you can come and go as you see fit. So.......SAVE THE DATE



From Onehouse Rectory May 2019

One of my favourite places to visit as a child was the ruins of Reading Abbey in the centre of Reading, in Berkshire, where I did some of my growing up. There was an amazing atmosphere in that place which had been founded by Henry 1 in 1211 and was presided over by monks from Cluny in France. It became one of the pilgrimage centres of medieval

England as well as one of the richest and most important religious houses. It held over 230 relics and was often visited by royalty. The Abbey was dedicated to Mary, Mother of Jesus and John the Evangelist. On one of its ancient walls, there hangs a copy of "Sumer is icumen in" which was first written down in the Abbey about 1240 and is the earliest known six part harmony song from Britain. The original is held in the British Library. Sadly, the Abbey, along with many others at the time, was dissolved in 1539, but its ruins hold many secrets not least that piece of music and I'm delighted to say that there has been renewed interest in the place recently with concerts and performances of different kinds within its ancient walls.

Music and the time of year remind me of another ancient foundation, Magdalen College, Oxford founded in 1458. The choir of that place came into being in 1480 and there have been May Day Celebrations with the Choir singing from the top of the College Tower dating back to the 16th Century. Although the Choir's repertoire is now varied, they used to sing "Sumer is icumen in" at 6am on the 1 May.

The year seems to be galloping along at quite a pace. We have just experienced the lows and highs of Good Friday and Easter and already we are moving on. Quite clearly summer is coming ["sumer is icumen in"]. In the Church Calendar, we consider all those appearances of the risen Jesus with such deep meaning for the disciples and for us until Ascension Day on Thursday 30 May [this year] when Jesus returned to His heavenly Father.

As we examine and study those appearances we remember that we too are "Resurrection People". Christians who believe that Jesus died for us taking our sins upon Himself and fulfilling the Law and the Prophets by showing His great love for all humankind. Jesus' resurrection from death reminds us of triumph and hope and the knowledge that nothing not even death can separate us from God's love.

The seasons move on; May heralds summer's arrival, but we are constantly reminded of Jesus' presence every single day to comfort, to strengthen, to guide, to love us if we choose to accept these things. Two of the many joys of living and working in this group of churches and communities are the weekly pattern of short services in our different churches [Wednesday Communion; Morning prayer; Midday prayer Evening prayer; reflective services; sometimes Compline] and the many social events to which everyone is welcome and which can be such a joy.

"Thy Kingdom Come" is a global prayer movement inviting Christians to pray during the 9 days between Ascension Day [30 May] and Pentecost [Whitsunday 9 June]. A most attractive "Daily Prayer for Thy Kingdom Come" booklet has been produced to encourage our prayer times which we hope to use on:

Tuesdays 11.45 am at Buxhall Thursdays 4.30 pm at Great Finborough

Saturdays 10.00 am Combs

Why not join us, you are most welcome as everyone is always welcome at all our services? The Bishop has asked all parishes to be represented at the Cathedral on Sunday 9 June at 4pm to celebrate 'Thy Kingdom Come' and Pentecost.

"Sumer is icumen in". Perhaps this summer we can give ourselves some quiet time to think and wait on God amidst our busy lives.
