Great Finborough Parish Council

The May meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 13th of the month at 7.30pm. The following matters were discussed and noted;

Outgoing Chairman, Peter Turner, chaired the first Item which was to nominate and elect a new Chairman. Simon Tarabella was nominated and accepted and took over chair of the meeting. Sebastian Reeves was nominated and accepted the post of Vice Chairman. James Spencer made up the remainder of the Parish Council from those village residents that had put themselves forward for election.

Having four posts vacant the Chairman asked for volunteers to coopt onto the Parish Council. Peter Turner, Dee Dixon and Simon Waspe all volunteered and were duly voted in and took their place on the Council. This leaves one seat vacant and the Council asks that any interested village resident contact the Parish Clerk for more details.

The meeting schedule for 2019/20 was agreed and dates are published in this newsletter. The various financial governance and accounting statements for the year ending 31 March 2019 were completed and approved. The implementation of the National Salary awards was approved as were the monthly payments to contractors.

Planning applications were considered and application notifications noted.

James Spencer volunteered to take on the role of Footpath Warden. It was agreed to take forward the idea of producing a footpath map of the Parish and costs and funding streams will be investigated. It was noted that there is a vacancy for the post of Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator within the village.

Our resident ornithologist Barry Cutler led a very early morning outing on the 5 May to listen to the Dawn Chorus in the churchyard. The early risers amongst us reported a beautiful array of birdsong and a fine sunrise.

The AGM, Bring and Buy Plant Sale and Social on was held on 9 May and attended by 26 members of the club. They had an amazing selection of plants and seedlings to choose from and a choice of delicious homemade cakes to go with their coffee. The business part of the meeting progressed smoothly and the Treasurer revealed that we had been able to donate £1200.00 to St Andrews church for the ongoing church improvement fund as a result of Open Gardens and the profit from the purchase of bird seed resulted in a series of smaller donations as follows; to the Parish Council: for maintenance of the herb garden, to St Andrew's Church for the Brown Bins and to the Pettiward Hall.

This month the club has also installed John Davey's memorial sign in the allotments and the bench alongside the footpath.

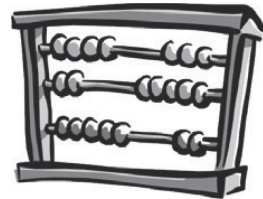

There is much misunderstanding about this ministry and I can do little better than to quote from the preface to the monthly service at St Edmundsbury Cathedral.

'Life is a journey towards wholeness and from time to time we all need healing. At different times we are more aware of the healing we need, whether emotional, spiritual or physical. Circumstances and events bring to our attention the parts of our lives where there is pain brokenness and disease. God sustains us on this journey, drawing us

towards healing and wholeness. Sometimes, God disturbs us so that healing can take place. Always, God is within us and around us, for 'underneath are the everlasting arms'. The backdrop for all our experience, all our suffering, is that at some point our lives will end and until then we are likely to experience aches and pains, illness and disease. Wholeness and healing include the great range of experiences we have that bring us towards inner healing, towards greater wholeness in mind, body and spirit, greater unity with God - often through our experiences of pain and anguish. Healing comes in different ways and often in unexpected ways. When we pray for healing, what we receive is not always what we hoped for. Healing often involves forgiveness, learning to forgive ourselves as well other people. Healing also includes acceptance and trust, as well as recovery.'

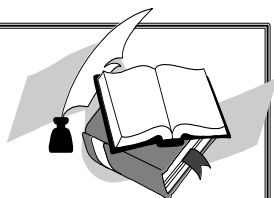

Is it too early to talk about Christmas???

Here we are in June and I wonder if it's too early to mention the "C" word!! The reason I will is because St Andrew's Parochial Church Council (PCC) as lead event sponsor, in conjunction with other village community groups is arranging a traditional Christmas day lunch in Pettward Hall.

The principle aim of the event is to provide any resident of Great Finborough who would otherwise be on their own on Christmas day, with an invitation to a community traditional Christmas day lunch with the fellowship and friendship of others residents within the village, at no cost to them.

The guest list criteria would be as follows:

1. Resident of Gt Finborough who would otherwise be on their own on Christmas Day.
2. Resident of Gt Finborough who for financial reasons would not be able to afford to cook a nutritional Christmas lunch.
3. Resident of the adjacent parishes of Buxhall and Onehouse who would otherwise be on their own on Christmas Day.
4. An individual nominated at the discretion of Chris/Pauline from within the benefice that would otherwise be on their own on Christmas day or for financial reasons would not be able to afford to cook a nutritional Christmas lunch.

For those requiring transport this will be arranged either by car or minibus if numbers require. There will be a driver plus escort to help people to their door.

The event is expected to take place from midday on Christmas day until approx. 4pm. Defibrillator

In 2017 the Parish Council procured the redundant Telephone box in the village and with help from our local District and County Councillors purchased a defibrillator to install in it for community use.

This is a great asset for the village, is easy to use and has been deployed on several occasions as directed by the emergency services when calling 999.

It requires very little maintenance other than regular checks carried out by village residents. Could I please ask that if you are directed to collect the defibrillator by the emergency services that, after you have returned it and the emergency has been resolved, you contact myself (whether the defibrillator has been used or not) so that I can carry out checks to ensure that it is ready in all aspects for a future deployment should the need arise. My number and email are inside the cabinet and in Who's Who on the back page of the newsletter.

Thank you very much for your help in keeping this very important village asset readily available for all.
