Due to the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic the Parish Council meeting scheduled for 11May at 7.30pm was held remotely via Zoom platform.

Cllr Tarabella was elected to serve as Chairman for another year with Cllr Reeves elected as Vice Chairman.

County Cllr Penny Otton gave her report which can be found on the village website. She also confirmed that Mid Suffolk recycling Plants would reopen, please see pages 7 and 8.

The final accounts for the year ending 31 March 2020 were approved as was the completed Annual Governance and Accountability return.

There were no planning applications to consider but it was noted that the ammended application DC/18/04491 to build 28 dwellings on the land adjacent to Buxhall Lodge had been refused.

The footpath warden reported two broken footpath bridges which will be investigated for repair options. Discussions also took place regarding recent complaints reference the marking of several footpaths across farmers' fields and the moving of footpath signage. Cllr Turner volunteered to discuss with landowners with a view to resolving the issue.

The Chestnut Horse

With the current situation and abiding by Government guidance Sharon and Robert have, with regret, had to close the pub until further notice.

They are now running a community village shop and takeaway service. The shop is open from 12 – 2pm on Wednesday through to Saturdays inclusive. The Takeaway service is open from 4.30 to 7.30pm Wednesday through to Saturday and 12 to 5pm for Sunday Roasts. Pre-booking for all takeaways is essential. The shop is also open during the takeaway opening times. You can find the takeaway menu and "Build your Burger" menu on pages 38 and 39 of the newsletter.

All social distancing rules are being adhered to with a strict one person in the shop at any one-time policy. Items stocked include all basic necessities such as bread, milk, fresh vegetables, eggs and much, much more. They also supply bacon, ham and sausages from M&M butchers in Stowupland and if anyone has any specific meat requirements they can organise that with their supplier.

You can place orders over the phone or via the pubs Facebook messaging service and a local delivery service is available within the village for those that are self-isolating. We hope to see you very soon.

Public to access Suffolk's Recycling Centres by appointment only

A new online booking system will be in place when Suffolk's Recycling Centres re-open on Thursday May 14. This appointment-only system is necessary to help reduce traffic disruption and queueing on roads around the sites and help manage additional demand on the waste sites. There are also new temporary restrictions and guidelines in place at all sites to support the safety of staff and members of the public.

Suffolk County Council has been working with its contractor FCC Environment to put plans in place to re-open all eleven sites to make sure that visits to the Recycling Centres are as safe as possible for residents and staff. In order to reopen the sites safely, people will need to book a time online when they can arrive and dispose of their waste. Through the online booking process, the council wants to limit the length of queuing on roads outside the Recycling Centres, which have occurred elsewhere in the country when sites have reopened. If you do not have an appointment, you will be denied access and turned away from the site.

Those who are shielding or at greatest risk of Covid-19 should continue to follow Government guidance and not visit a Recycling Centre. There will be a phased approach to opening the sites fully in order to ease congestion and prioritise residents. There will also be a set of new temporary rules, which residents must check before arriving at the sites.

During phase one, these temporary rules include:

No access to site without pre-booking

Cars and pedestrians only - no vans, trailers or commercial-type vehicles

One adult to unload, unless 2 adults needed for heavy items

No staff assistance to unload vehicles

No chargeable waste accepted (soil, rubble, hardcore or plasterboard)

No trade waste and No textiles or re-use items accepted

The booking system is designed to support social distancing by ensuring that only a safe number of visitors can access the sites at any one time. It will also help reduce waiting times for visitors and manage traffic to avoid a dangerous build-up of cars on the highway.

The booking site will be live from 3pm Tuesday 12 May, with the first appointments being made for Thursday. To make a booking, please visit www.suffolk.gov.uk/recyclingcentres or call 0345 606 6067. In order to control the queues residents without a booking will not be able to enter the site. Residents must not arrive on site more than 5 minutes before their allocated time.

In line with the Government's recommendation, Suffolk County Council is urging residents to only make a booking if their waste or recycling cannot be stored safely at home or disposed of through other legitimate routes. Visitors are also advised to wash their hands before and after visiting site and gloves should be worn during the visit. Presorting waste into material type before visiting the site will help to speed up your visit and reduce waiting times.

Each of the eleven sites has a detailed traffic management plan, along with a maximum number of people that will be allowed on site at any one time to maintain safety. The traffic plan has been worked out in partnership with Suffolk Highways, to limit the impact on roads around each site.

Any waste you have which is contaminated or suspected to have being contaminated with COVID 19 must be double-bagged and kept at home for 72 hours before it is brought to site.

Below is just a snapshot of the great work going on as Suffolk comes together to respond to the Covid-19 outbreak:

- An elderly women, who lives alone, needed help with her medication delivery which was arranged for the longer-term. She was also offered the number of a near-by befriending service which she was very happy to accept.
- A social worker contacted Help, But Not Alone with concerns for a couple she works with. They live in temporary accommodation and needed a food delivery that day. An emergency food package was arranged from the same day and provisions were made with a local shop to take payment over the phone for longer-term support. The social worker was grateful for the help received.

 A neighbour raised concerns about an elderly man who she hadn't seen for a while. The team at Home, But Not Alone made contact with him and he reassured the officer that he was getting help from friends and family with food deliveries. The phoneline details were left with him in case he needed help on another occasion and he was very thankful for the support offered.

There have been 7,600 calls taken since the phoneline was set up. Phone calls are answered and cases managed by staff at each district, borough or county council depending on the type of enquiry. Wherever possible we link people in need with local groups and businesses, who are doing an amazing job in our communities. This phoneline is for vulnerable people in our communities, and not for general Coronavirus enquiries.

Mental Health: A new 24/7 helpline offering immediate support for mental health difficulties during the coronavirus pandemic has been set up by the Norfolk and Suffolk Foundation Trust. The freephone service, called First Response it is available on **0808 196 3494**.

Tribe Volunteers: Officers from the District and Borough Councils continue to make contact with volunteers registered on the app to match them into local voluntary roles either within new community groups or with other local charities who require support.

Foodbanks: We continue to ensure there is a resilient supply of food delivered directly to food banks across Suffolk. Before the pandemic, Suffolk had 12 foodbanks – it now has 46. So far this week, with the help of the Ministry of Defence, 2.4tonnes of food has been distributed to foodbanks across Suffolk from FareShare.

East Suffolk & North Essex NHS Foundation Trust has collaborated with Suffolk Family Carers charity to introduce a scheme called **At My Bedside** to allow patients and their friends and families to stay in touch during their hospital stay. As soon as a patient is taken into hospital, staff are able to identify what is in place for the person to be touch with those people who are most important to them. Volunteers managed by Suffolk Family Carers will then speak to family members about any specific support needs they may have. As we enter phase 2 of lockdown, please remember to stay home as much as possible and continue to wash your hands. We are grateful to everyone who works in our communities and continues to look out for one another.

We are also looking to arrange a work party, when it is safe to do so to help in some of the repairs that may be required. Any volunteers gratefully accepted.

News from your District Councillor - John Matthissen

Virus response - people

Council staff are ensuring all areas have voluntary groups co-ordinating and supplementing the informal family and neighbour support for those unable to go out to shops, pharmacies etc. Back up to this is the Suffolk – wide Help line - 0800 876 6926 - Our staff are helping to run this.

People eligible for Council Tax support have been given £150 grants which will eliminate their bills altogether for the year.

Staff have been extremely busy in housing all homeless, rough sleepers and also sofa surfers in order to reduce risk of virus transmission. Council houses falling vacant are not being inspected and repaired for reletting as moving house is discouraged by government at present. This creates extra pressure. Achieving these actions required the renting of two entire hotels in the district, recently reduced to one.

Virus response – businesses and organisations

The council is able to support small businesses with grants and so far, has distributed over £32M to nearly 3000 businesses across both districts, which should be reimbursed by Government. Officers have tried to make contact will all small businesses but there are still some outstanding. More information about how to apply for a grant is available on the website. https://www.babergh.gov.uk/business/businessrates/grant-funding-schemes/

Organisations eligible for business rate discounts, such as charities, village halls, rural shops and pubs have had additional help.

Emergency needs grants of up to £2500 have been paid out to groups playing a key role in protecting vulnerable residents.

Meetings - Since the lockdown more and more internal meetings are being held on-line, and as much council business as possible continues, with all staff working at home. Formal meetings have begun with planning committees and cabinet, with a Scrutiny committee coming next. Political group leaders are being kept up to date with regular meetings with the Chief Executive.

Decisions - Under delegated powers as augmented by government legislation some key decisions have been made by the chief executive. Most significant are the approval of section 106 conditions regarding Snoasis, approval of £2.2m Improvements to the Stowmarket Leisure Centre and amendments to our statement of community involvement which means no site notices for planning applications.

Government has instructed councils to keep the planning system moving, with increased delegated decisions, but ward councillors can ask for decisions to be made by committee where they feel it is essential.

Building sites – where MSDC have works in progress, these have been suspended for the present.

Waste services – the collection teams have been depleted by illness and self-isolation but managed to maintain collections of green and black bins by suspending the brown bin service. This will resume Monday 11 May.



June 2020 from the Onehouse Rectory

Dear Friends

In spite of the dreadful pandemic which is causing us all to proceed with great caution, it was lovely to see some of the celebrations for VE Day 75 taking place in our Parish on 8 May. I have it on good authority that Combs Rectory was bedecked with bunting and flags; we managed to fly a 1935 Silver Jubilee Union Jack from our window and Forest Road houses were

covered with decorations and afternoon tea being "taken" in many front gardens with social distancing paramount as always. I'm quite sure that all our villages managed some form of celebrations.

It's been absolutely right to give thanks for those who gave their lives in order to give us victory over the scourge of Nazi-ism in the WWII. We need to remember as well those who were injured in body, mind or spirit. We were permitted to let one person enter each of our 7 churches before 11am to say prayers; to keep a 2 minute silence and to ring a bell to remember.

Those wonderful celebrations to mark victory in Europe Day 1945 were amazing and richly deserved. People needed to rejoice; they needed to express their thanks; they needed to be together. We give thanks for VE Day; for peace from further World Wars even though we mustn't forget other wars since. We also remember that in his Christmas Day Broadcast 1939, King George VI used these words from a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins given to him by his 13 year old daughter, Princess Elizabeth.

"I said to the man who stood at the Gate of the Year Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown. And he replied,

Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light, and safer than a known way. "

Those words meant a lot to the people listening far and wide. They meant a lot to the King and his family. So much so that they are etched in glass around the entrance to the little cave-like prayer space in St. George's Chapel, Windsor, where King George VI and Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother have their final resting places. VE Day was a day to rejoice. Around 3.8 million men and 400,000 women returned home at the end of the Second World War. (Later more would return home from the Far East.)

My Mother (now 94) was a Ship's Writer serving in the Wrens stationed on the banks of the River Clyde. She remembers seeing many more people wandering around in the rain on VE Day. Sadly, she was on duty that day working in a former whisky distillery devoid of any whisky of course! People sang and danced; they "toasted the peace that had come to our shores; there was a sense of utter relief and joy – fireworks; church bells; street parties and beer."

Our present enemy, the Corona Virus, is different from those WWII days. It can't be seen and can be devastating which is why we need to remember the words of our present Queen WE WILL MEET AGAIN and to take our cue from the likes of Captain Tom Moore now aged 100 and his 100 laps of his garden raising a huge amount for NHS Charities providing help and comfort for many.

We shall continue to emerge carefully from our homes as we are allowed to do so. Like post WWII, it will be a different world in many ways, but, we hope, a better one. There are many who are sad; there are many finding life extremely hard but my mother's spirits were lifted greatly by the afternoon tea she "shared" with her neighbours in her Close. They have all decided to meet together soon for another tea.

A Mothers' Union friend sent me this reflection by retired teacher, Kitty O'Meara from Wisconsin USA

"And the people stayed home. And read books, and listened, and rested, and exercised, and made art, and played games, and learned new ways of being, and were still. And listened more deeply.

Some meditated, some prayed, some danced, some met their shadows. And the people began to think differently.

And the people healed. And in the absence of people living in ignorant, dangerous, mindless and heartless ways, the earth began to heal.

And when the danger passed, and the people joined together again, they grieved their losses- and made new choices, and dreamed new images, and created new ways to live and heal the earth fully , as they had been healed."

Please take care, stay safe and may God continue to hold you in the hollow of His hand.

Firstly, may I thank all of you who have participated in the clearing, sawing, chopping and stacking of dead trees and brambles which was causing the growth of new saplings, wild flowers and ferns to be stunted. In this regard many thanks to Jeannie, Virginia, Kevin, Nick, Simon, Peter, Martin, Andy, Lee and especially to my husband Ian who sawed and staked out the pathway through the woods. A lot of hard work but we are extremely pleased of the outcome so far.

Secondly, I am happy to inform you that we were successfully awarded 105 saplings from the Woodland Trust donated by Sainsbury, Joules and the People's Postcode Lottery. These saplings will consist of British native trees; Silver Birch, Rowan, Wild Cherry, Dog Wood and Hawthorn all of which are due to be delivered for November planting. Would you let me know if you could participate in helping to plant the saplings in November?

Also, those of you who have excess woodland flowers in your garden and would like to plant them in the wood then please feel free. We would be especially grateful of English bluebells, snowdrops, daffodils etc which are native to woodlands but remember, don't take these from verges as some are protected species.

Thirdly, and as a precautionary note, please be aware of trees that have become rotten and are prone to topple especially in high winds. We have been clearing a number of these trees over the weeks but as you can appreciate this will take some time.

On another note although the vast majority of dog owners are extremely thoughtful in clearing up after their 'best friends' there are a minority who do not. Please use the bins provided for this purpose as your consideration allows our children to play without the inconvenience of stepping into mess.
