Great Finborough Parish Council

There was no meeting of the Parish Council in August. The items below were discussed at the July meeting.

Suffolk Highways have launched a community self-help scheme to allow PC's to carry out small local maintenance tasks such as cleaning road signs. Further information to be sought to clarify the scope of works and insurance liabilities.

Withdrawal of the rural bus service. This is a matter of great concern and further information is being sought to determine village usage and possible alternative bus services.

Parking Issues

Concerns have been expressed to councillors regarding on street parking in the High Road, safety issues are highlighted especially around the bend between the Primary School and The Chestnuts and at the entrance to Church Road. Residents are requested to give thought to the safety of others when parking in the High Road, do not use the pavement and do not obscure visibility for exiting Church Road or overtaking on blind bends. If there is no improvement in the safety of on street parking the matter will be passed to Suffolk Police for action.

It was agreed to proceed with the purchase of another Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) for the village as data collected from the original VAS has shown some reduction in speeds throughout the village. Funding is in place with a generous resident donation and contributions from County and District councillor's locality budgets. Further speed reduction schemes such as "entrance gates" will be discussed at the next meeting

Stowmarket Food Bank

More donations of food are always welcome and as the school holidays are ending, stocks of tinned rice pudding and packets of instant custard and Angel Delight have been depleted. Tins of hot dog sausages are also particularly needed. Toiletries including loo rolls are included in each box of food sent out, so these are also welcome. All the local churches, library, town council offices and most supermarkets have collection boxes. There is now also a pop-up shop on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9am-1pm at the Hillside Community Centre. This is stocked with items at the end of their best before dates etc.

Bus Services

The last vestiges of service 461 to Buxhall and Finborough are currently being reviewed while funding has been provided up to March 2020. On 21 September Galloway are stopping the 386 service from Bury via Rattlesden which serves Harleston and Onehouse. The County Council will be seeking other providers and funding to continue this route.

Great Finborough Wildflower Meadow


We started preparing the three-quarter acre piece of land adjacent to Woodpecker Hill in the late summer of 2013 by spraying off the weeds. In the spring of 2014, the weeds were still plentiful and during that summer we sprayed it 3 more times. Spring of 2015, with the help of Gareth Hart, a tractor and agricultural rake the ground was prepared for seeding. With the seed provided by the Hart family and the Garden Club, Trevor Waspe, Simon Tarabella and I, set about seeding the meadow - with the expert guidance of Trevor, I must say. In late August of each year the meadow has been cut, which helps to spread the seed heads. The Wildflower Meadow was slow to establish but this year it has been at its very best and we hope it will continue to provide pleasure for many years to come.

On two days in July 2019 I spent a few hours identifying the grasses and plants in the meadow. Both days were hot and glorious which brought out many different butterflies enjoying the variety of plants and grasses. The white Oxeye Daisy is everywhere on the meadow and creates a beautiful scene in June and early July. Looking closely I could spot most of the plants that were sown – including the white and light pink Yarrow, lovely clumps of honey-scented Lady's Bedstraw, yellow Birdsfoot Trefoil and perforated St John's Wort (hold a leaf up to the light and see lots of tiny holes), bold stands of tall Greater Burdock near the hedge. The delicate heads of the grasses were pretty with great names – Catstail, Meadow Foxtail, Sweet Vernal grass. Common Sorrell dominates at the end of July with its rust coloured seed heads standing high. The bees and butterflies were loving the Spear Thistle and the red and white clover. Thank you to Pete and the Parish Council for providing and maintaining such a special place. **Mary Smyth**
