Great Finborough Parish Council

Due to the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic the Parish Council meeting scheduled for 12 October at 7.30pm was held remotely via Zoom platform.

MSDC confirmed that there has been no call for an election to fill the current vacancy on the Parish Council therefore the PC are free to Coopt. Closing date for applications is 14 November. The way forward with the street lights is still under discussion to ensure they meet the needs of the village in future years. The play area risk assessment was reviewed and findings were that it is generally being used responsibly with only short periods around the school finishing times being cause for concern. Numbers and behaviour will be monitored and a decision on closure for this period will be discussed as necessary.

There were 3 planning applications to consider to which the Council had no objections at this time. Full details can be found in the minutes of the meeting on the Parish website.

A second quote and final draft design for the wildflower meadow information board will be sought for consideration at the next meeting.



So as I said at the beginning, I am sure we are trying to keep calm and carry on amidst these present troubles, many people are trying to make life as normal as possible and Remember, Remember those who have loved you, those who have given their lives that you might enjoy yours, those who have fought for our system of government and those who try to raise money to fight the diseases that afflict so many of us today. Support them and encourage when you can.
