EXTRACTS OF INTEREST FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THE 12 JUNE 2017

Defibrillator — It was noted that completed transfer agreement had been received from BT for the phone box. It was noted that an application has been submitted to Awards for All. It was resolved to purchase the defibrillator from Community Heartbeat Trust at a cost of £1750.00 + delivery as soon as confirmation of external funding is received.

Speed Indicator Device – It was confirmed that the site allocation has been submitted. Quotes received for the purchase of a mobile SID complete with batteries and brackets ranging between £3150 - £2373 were considered with the Radarlux machine seeming best value for money. District and County support via locality budgets has been promised from Cllrs Otton and Matthissen. Further fundraising will be necessary together with the formation of a group to take on responsibility for moving the device around various sites once approved. Suggestions for future fundraising included: contact Zoe Banthorpe at MSDC local business support and Parish Council reserves. Cllr Turner will contact Zoe in the first instance.

Church Road parking improvements – Consideration was given to two quotes for the tree work ranging from £1475 - £735 with one further quote to come in. A site visit will be arranged to discuss plans and to take appropriate measurements before SCC Highways are contacted for their advice on any link to the highway. Various surfacing options were considered and quotes will be sought once measurements are confirmed. It was noted that advice would be sought from any contractor regarding adequate and proper drainage of the area. Zoe Banthorpe at MSDC will be contacted for advice on external funding for this project

Land for future development

A study has of Mid Suffolk, Babergh, Ipswich and Suffolk Coastal has concluded that about 1600 new homes will be needed each year across those four districts. Discussion will continue as to the numbers for each district. This will inform our new Local Plan now in preparation together with the allocation of sufficient land from the recent bids submitted by landowners, Including some for business premises.

The preliminary assessment of these has been completed so that the obviously unsustainable plots have been eliminated and this information will be made public for a consultation in August and September. Consultation responses will be used to further reduce the land which will be proposed for allocation as part of the new Local Plan. New policies for deciding planning applications are also being prepared.

Mind where you step

No agenda item appears as regularly on Parish Council agendas as dog mess; it is both a concern to many and a seemingly intractable problem. In theory offending owners can be prosecuted for allowing their dog to leave mess on pavements or footpaths, but very few cases ever get put on trial. This is due to the understandable reluctance of witnesses to follow through on their complaints against local neighbours. One possible approach pioneered locally is to seek the active support of responsible dog owners to report offenders to the parish footpath officer, who can then ask the District Council to warn repeat offenders. Less drastic than prosecution but often still effective.

Star House Lane closure

While this inconvenience should end around the time you are reading, some explanation may be useful. The closure was related to the new

main needed to provide additional water supply for the Chilton Leys development. Through discussion with the engineer in charge I heard that closure was a decision of Suffolk County Council not Anglian Water, which I questioned, but still don't understand. I can sympathise with the locals who reopened the lane one weekend, and with everyone inconvenienced by a closed but deserted road blocked for a month.

Locality Awards

I am delighted to say that the budget available in 2015/16 has been repeated for the 2017/18 year, and I will be pleased to hear from local organisations active in the 5 villages, or with a significant membership living here, with projects which would benefit from a little financial help. This obviously includes Parish Councils, but other groups are welcome to apply. The scheme launches in August and initial awards will follow in October, but I will be willing to discuss ideas from now on. It should be noted that this is a budget for one year only, with no certainty of continued support in future years.


BARN DANCE

HEALTH INFORMATION EXCHANGE ROLL-OUT

A pilot project which enables GPs and hospital clinicians to securely view each other's patient records is to be rolled out across west Suffolk. The information-sharing scheme has been road-tested by patient volunteers at Hardwicke House surgery in Sudbury for the past 12 months. And it has proved so effective that it is now in the process of being introduced at 10 other practices in the west of the county. It is hoped that the project, which relies on patients giving their consent for their personal data to be shared, will soon be in operation across the whole of Suffolk.

The Health Information Exchange (HIE) scheme enables the medical records held by a patient's GP to be accessible to hospital doctors and nursing staff, and vice versa. It increases efficiency and improves healthcare by speeding up treatment times and significantly reducing the number of wasted or cancelled appointments. Previously GPs and hospital staff have had to spend a lot of time chasing up each other's medical notes, causing delays in treating patients. A pilot scheme was launched early last year involving volunteer patients from Hardwicke House, which has practices in Sudbury, Great Cornard, Bures and Clare. The practice caters for around 23,000 patients around nine per cent of West Suffolk Hospital's catchment area. Phil Worsley, secretary of the Patient Participation Group at Hardwicke House, said: "My fellow PPG members and I think that the principle of sharing medical records between GPs and hospitals is an excellent initiative. "Some people get uptight about the thought of their personal data being shared, but our members were happy to give consent for their medical records to be accessed. "Many people have experienced cancelled or wasted appointments due to their GP or hospital staff not being able to access each other's records. "Only recently a patient who had been discharged from West Suffolk Hospital told me their GP was able to access all their records from the ward and consultant the following day."

David Cripps, Practice Manager at Hardwicke House, said: "Currently too many patients are turning up at hospital for appointments only to be sent home because their GP has been unable to supply the necessary paperwork. "The patient's time is being wasted, the doctor's time is being wasted, nurses' time is being wasted — all of which delays treatment and costs the NHS money.

"Information sharing with consent makes patient care safer, saves money and increases efficiency. "If we want a sustainable local hospital we have to move processes into the 21st Century and use technology to help us to help patients' Dermot O'Riordan, Chief Clinical Information Officer for the West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust, said the HIE scheme would benefit patients hugely. "It's really exciting because it breaks down the barriers between different clinical IT systems regarding the information being held on patients," he said. "The scheme enables GPs and hospital clinicians to access the most up-to-date data held on an individual. This information is only used for direct patient care.

"If a confused patient is admitted to hospital overnight we can access their GP records to see what medication they're on and what allergies they might have. We can also check if they have underlying chronic health problems. "We've already had examples of cancer treatment being sped up because fellow clinicians have been able to see the results of tests patients had already undergone. "This scheme is part of a much larger ongoing e-Care project. West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust is committed to giving patients access their own medical records and results. "Patients can authorise sharing of their medical records at any time. They will also be asked to consent when attending surgery or hospital for treatment or appointments.

But in an emergency, if a patient is unable to give their consent, a clinician can assume consent to check on existing health conditions, medication and allergies. A log is kept of every time a patient's records are accessed.

The aim is for all healthcare professionals, including paramedics, district nurses and physiotherapists, to have access to patient records. The pilot scheme is currently being rolled out to the Market Cross, Botesdale, Woolpit, Brandon, Victoria Street, Angel Hill, Long Melford, Wickhambrook, Stanton and Clare Guildhall practices.

It is hoped to extend the scheme to the remaining 13 practices in west Suffolk – all of which use a different IT system – by the end of summer.
