# The Annual Parish Meeting held on 8 May 2018.

The Annual Parish Meeting attendance was down on last year which was somewhat disappointing, although those that did attend heard positive report from all the organizations in the village together with the reports from our District and County Councillors. Reports were received from the following: St Andrew's Church, the Pettiward Hall Committee, Gt Finborough Church Primary School, the Garden Club, the Allotment Association, the Editor of the Village Newsletter and Woodpecker Hill Trust.

In his report the chairman highlighted several village projects that had been successfully completed this year, namely:

- Re-establishment of the ditch between Woodpecker Hill and Pilgrim Court.
- Improvements to the parking area in Church Road
- Completion of the Communal Herb garden and the paths around it
- The purchase of the defibrillator for the village and two professional training seminars completing the training of some 50 residents.
- The purchase of a VAS (vehicle activated sign) to assist traffic calming in the village.
- A second picnic table at the wild flower meadow.

My sincere thanks to Penny Otten and John Matthissen for financial help from their locality budgets and to the Garden Club for their financial contributions.

This year marks the last year of this council's term of office, next May will see elections for Gt Finborough Parish Council and I urge anyone who feels they can contribute, to give some thought to standing for election. Finally, a big thank you to the parish councillors and our parish clerk for their sterling work this year.

# **Gt Finborough Church Primary School.**

A report from the Primary School given at the Annual Parish meeting by **Ant Mann**, a school governor. A personal tragedy has had an enormous impact on the school recently, however results are good with Ofsted giving an outstanding mark for some school features and recent SAT's results are very good. The Board of Governors is at full strength and the recent school residential trips to Scarborough, Scotland and Pembrokeshire have been excellent. Staffing as always remains a challenge but financially the school is in a good position. The Parish Council was thanked for their contribution to the outside area improvements which are hoped to be completed over the summer. The school is about to launch a social media project by embarking on Facebook. It has been established that the flashing lights on the road approaching the school do work, but need a key to operate them, the location of which remains a mystery so reactivating them is a work in progress. The parking issues at pick up and drop off times seem to have lessened with no recent complaints received.

The question was asked if 11yr olds were being encouraged to join in with the Crucial Crew sessions at "The Mix" Ant confirmed that he would investigate this. Question asked as to whether all village children get a place in school, it was confirmed that there is a waiting list, however there is no issue with local children getting a school place, over at least the last 10 years all village children wanting a place got one. Questions were asked as to whether the school could promote the mobile library to encourage more people to use the service which visits the car park at 4pm every fourth week. Ant confirmed that the school would be happy to promote this. Question asked about the current role numbers and it was confirmed that the current number of 142 children is expected to reduce by approximately 20 leavers in September with an estimated 20 plus new starters, so numbers would be remaining around 140 for 2019.

# Proposal for houses to be built on land at Pear Tree Place

In November 2017 the Parish Council said that it would raise **NO OBJECTION** to 24 homes being built on land adjoining Woodpecker Hill. As always, the destruction of green open space is controversial. Some are against such a build and others support it. The built—in dislike of those who may seem to some to be "cashing-in" with little interest in listening to those who find such development abhorrent is understandable.

However, in such a case there is room for compromise and an opportunity to influence such a development for the good of the village. The present governmental attitude is to place the build of new houses as a priority. It would seem also that this will happen whether we approve of it or not. Therefore, at the meeting of the Parish Council on 27 November 2017 the village Councillors made this statement: -

"If MSDC are minded to approving this application the Parish Council would like the opportunity to work with the developers as much as possible as this scheme progresses. We would appreciate being involved in any CIL decisions in order that we might ensure that 24 new properties in the village are fully sustainable.

Concerns are expressed that the details used for the bus provision in the parish are incorrect, the only current bus service for Great Finborough is one bus to and from Stowmarket on a Monday and Thursday, the promise of a BSEVC funded service on a further two days a week for the period of a year is very welcome, however concerns are expressed about how this will be funded after that. The current bus is a 16-seater which is almost always full by the time it reaches Great Finborough, it is thought that this is far from a sustainable service to which additional development can be added for the long term.

The High Road through Great Finborough experiences a high rate of speeding vehicles as borne out by the applicants traffic survey date, the average of 39mph is unacceptable with the access and egress of an additional 24 properties onto the High Road. Great Finborough has an active Community Speedwatch and have recently purchased a

mobile SID machine in an effort to reduce the speed of traffic through the village. We ask that the developer consider assisting us with a financial contribution towards a new speed gun and further speed safety measures, such as average speed cameras or alternative measures that may be suggested by Highways Offers in order to help reduce the danger of what will become a busy junction at Pear Tree Woodpecker Hill is a valued and well used VIOS (Visually important open space) and protection of this community amenity is paramount for the Parish Council. We request that advance structural planting along the boundary with Woodpecker Hill is a priority before any site clearance and build is commenced. A staggered double line of mature trees must be planted to protect the community asset. Some concerns have been expressed that these proposed properties are on an elevated site that will be visible from Valley Lane and the surrounding area and landscape screening must be a priority. application contains proposals for open space which is commended with the provision of a play area within one of these open spaces. It is suggested support for the existing play provision in the village would be welcomed. The Parish Council have serious financial constraints and maintenance and upkeep of the existing provision is difficult, taking on a further play area would not be possible and an ongoing contribution to the future of the existing play provision would be preferable."

In addition, it must be noted that effective drainage is of paramount importance so that neither the High Road nor the lands in direction of Valley Lane and land in Woodpecker Hill and Wildflower Meadow are not adversely affected by sewage, land drains and flood damage. The village will benefit from a fixed percentage of development money. It seems that it is better to work with the developers and influence the new build than simply oppose the unopposable.

**Planning a Project? -- Pre-application work will help** — If you are considering work that will need planning approval, consulting neighbours, the Parish Council and the Planning Department before submitting the application may save a lot of trouble. Although the District Council now charges for pre-application advice, this can often save repeated changes and extra fees later on. An on-site discussion with a planning officer, a representative of the Parish Council and the ward councillor will usually highlight problems which can be modified to achieve greater consensus and improve the chances of approval.

# From the Rectory June 2018

I am sure you will all join with me in welcoming Pauline and Rod Higham to the Rectory in Onehouse. Pauline comes to work with me as a priest and Rod as a Reader, sharing with the others across the 7 parishes. Pauline's contact details are as above, and I have asked her to write a mini biography for July's magazine. Thank you to the choirs, flower arrangers, drink pourers and churchwardens at Buxhall for all their work.

As I write the churches are preparing for Whitsun/Pentecost when Christians celebrate the coming of the Spirit. In Worship we often use the words "Come, Holy Spirit!". Sometimes we say them with anticipation and enthusiasm and sometimes not. I wonder whether we really know what we're asking for. Some might say we're playing with fire, and that we're messing with a wind mighty enough to blow the whole house down. We may feel all snug and secure in our churches, cosy in our ways with our friends and history, but the Spirit of God refuses to be confined or conformed. The Holy Spirit comes not only to comfort and guide us gently, but to huff and puff and and....

In this generation we stand on the brink of what scholar and author Phyllis Tickle calls "the Great Emergence." She says that every 500 years or so, the Holy Spirit comes in and cleans house, dismantling structures that have become tired and crumbling, upsetting the church's patterns and expectations, and digging out entrenched views. God is always up to something –often it is outside the church in the community and if we are not careful, those inside it don't notice. Do you look and engage with your community?

We are always in danger of domesticating our churches. For example, in a school last week, I was offered a battery-operated candle. They are a poor substitute for the real thing. How can we reclaim the great live fire of the Spirit with its wild, unpredictable, and holy ways? But this is not to say that we must always expect something that will upset us. Christians might say that the Spirit of God blew into the relationship between Ian Paisley and Martin McGuiness in Ulster and

peace came. Some might say the spirit of God is blowing between Kim Jong Un and Donald Trump – we pray – where do you see the spirit blowing in your life, community, church and the world?





# **Family Search**

I am looking for information about James Nettleton, who was my mother's husband. By 1937 he had taken over the reins of Great Finborough Post Office from Geraldine Chapman, who was in charge in 1916.
