

News from your District Councillor - John Matthissen

Council services - an apology

I am aware that people needing to access District Council services are not always being as well served as they should be. My questions to those in charge have revealed that almost 100 staff had left the council in the 9 months up to the end of December last. While replacements are being recruited, inevitably we have lost many years of experience and commitment to our District. I opposed the move of Council headquarters to Ipswich which has contributed to this loss of staff and is of course inconvenient for members of the public needing to visit in person.

Chilton Leys development plans – next phase

If you missed the February Onehouse Parish Council meeting, plans for the next 125 Taylor Wimpey homes at Chilton Leys will shortly appear at:

https://www.taylorwimpey.co.uk/proposeddevelopments/england/suffolk/stowmarket/chilton-leys

When these plans are submitted to Mid Suffolk DC, similar material plus more will appear on our web site as usual and will be open to consultation from this point. The public are no longer able to view plans in the council offices at Needham, now closed, but they can be viewed on screen in Stowmarket at our Public Access point, 54 Ipswich Street.

Other planning matters

Work continues examining the views submitted by 1370 people who have commented on the first draft of the Joint Local Plan. The development sites considered potentially suitable in the first draft will then be reviewed and a draft Local Plan will be published for consultation in early summer.

Because the Council is still considered not to have a Five-Year Housing Land Supply, we are still receiving many speculative planning applications and sometimes sites are cleared in advance of any application. This is the case with land and hedging beside Finborough Road approaching Stowmarket, amongst many other sites across the District.

Merger with Babergh District

It is currently unclear if or when this proposal will move forward, following leadership changes at Babergh.

Boundary review

The reorganisation of our District to equalise the electorates for a new 34-member council - expected to be announced on 6 February - has been deferred due to "some anomalies... with the electorate data and forecasts."

No doubt like many of you, I am impatiently awaiting signs of spring and all the opportunities it brings for gardeners.



In Memory of Mac Dobson

The sad and unexpected news of Mac Dobson's sudden demise reached us on 28 January.

Like so many people, I first met Mac in the Chestnut Horse in 1997 when he moved into the Old Forge. He had bought the property some time earlier in anticipation of his return to the UK, following a 20-year tour of duty as an engineer in Kenya.

That he had chosen the house next door to the Pub was no doubt just a happy coincidence but having done so, it would clearly have been rude for him to have done anything other than become a regular customer. Somewhat later, and in something of a natural progression, Mac took on the role of Landlord for a year or so before returning to his more natural environment on the punters' side of the bar. The foregoing may appear to suggest that all Mac did was drink beer when in fact nothing could be further from the truth - he was equally partial to a good single malt!

Mac, as many an erstwhile newcomer to the Village will attest, was more often than not the first to bid them welcome and engage them in conversation, whether in the hostelry, as contemplated above, or when out and about with his dog Barney (or for those who go back ten years or more, Barney's predecessor Luke).

This of course is all very much tongue in cheek, there was a great deal more to Mac. He was extremely good company, being a raconteur of some note, with stories concerning his years in Africa a specialism. He was also something of a philanthropist supporting two or three favourite charities as well as being more than willing to extend a helping hand wherever it might be needed closer to home.

It is easy, when writing anything resembling a eulogy, to fall into the trap of eulogising but, whilst Mac was not without his flaws, it is difficult to pin point any facet of his character that was in any way dislikeable. In an attempt to be even handed however, he did have an

innate albeit rather enviable ability to switch off from all that was going on around him. This may or may not have had something to do with his preferred pipe smoking a mixture of old tram tickets and dried camel dung but, in order to include something approaching a negative, it must be said that this could be a little frustrating, particularly if it happened in mid conversation.

Mac was a gentleman. I feel privileged to have known him and will miss him greatly; indeed, we are all much the poorer for his passing.

From the Rectory March 2018

Lent is underway as you read this although its only Ash Wednesday as I write. This morning's Coffee Morning in Onehouse which followed our Service, enjoyed homemade Cheese scones and chutney in deference to those who may have given up sweet sticky things for their Lenten observance, and possibly BMI. There was discussion on what might



be given up and why. I have always held the view that it is better to take on some additional reading or quiet time to reflect on life and its encounters, in the hope that we might deepen our discipleship and bring us closer to God.

I have just listened to our Bishops' Vlog, published every week. Bishop Martin wonders how we might 'disrupt' our life in Lent so that we encounter God differently. That puts a new slant on it, because he and Bishop Mike are suggesting that we might disrupt our normal pattern not in any self-denying sense of doing something we really don't want to do but by doing something else that is 'attractively disruptive'. This would probably be something that goes 'with the grain' — which we are more likely to do. One priest was recommended to find three things each day for which God is grateful to you. Another might be a change in routine....? Lent is a serious time for self -examination but perhaps need not be all 'sackcloth and ashes'?

11 with **Messy Church** on the 1st Sunday. Gt Finborough's Messy Church is now on the 1st Friday of the month at 3.45pm in church beginning on Friday 2 March. (Apologies to those who arrived in February, the cancellation message was not properly communicated)

There are two specific Mothering Sunday Family Services and Combs Children will be appropriately engaged.....
