# **Great Finborough Parish Council**

Our July meeting had the very rare occurrence of no Mid Suffolk planning applications to consider, it's a sure fact that they will come flooding in just when we have our August break and we will have to schedule in a special meeting to consider them.

**Planning** - Remember that residents can also make comments on applications that affect them and their community. The first step is to review the application on the Mid Suffolk District Council website or at their offices. The Parish Council agendas list application numbers with their address and proposal details which are open for comment, the time scale for comment is short so make sure that you submit your comments before the deadlines if you want them to be considered.

The quickest and easiest way to view or comment on an application is to use the planning application online facility on the District Councils website: <a href="https://www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/planning/application-search">https://www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/planning/application-search</a> and-comment

If you have a QR Scanner on your smart phone then aim your camera at this QR code for access to the website right now.

You may also view planning applications at the Council Offices and comment via a letter, please remember to add your name and address and the planning application reference number to any correspondence.

If you decide to visit the district council it is advisable to call first 0300 1234000, Option 5 to find out the planning helpdesk opening hours and to check that the relevant, up-to-date file will be available.

Please remember that your comments will be made available to the public and can be seen by everyone, so make sure your response is relevant and not defamatory or offensive. If you do not provide your name and address your comments will be treated as anonymous and your views will not be taken into account and your time wasted.

Feedback from Highways Engineer – Following a meeting with our Suffolk County Council Highways Engineer it is with frustration that we learn firstly; due to the gas pipes under the road we cannot get involved practically with the clearing of the pipes under Combs Lane to alleviate the flooding there, and secondly; that our application to install a priority system for traffic over Finborough bridge (Knights Bridge) is not supported by SCC Highways. It seems that an absence of accident data and the fact that the bridge is over the minimum width mean that we can't get a scheme similar to that over Burford Bridge. The Parish Council are keen going forward that any and all accidents or collisions with the bridge should be recorded so that a portfolio of evidence can be built for the future. Please let us know if you witness any. We will now look at other vehicle safety options for this stretch of road including speed restriction extensions and "horses" signage.

**Hosting a Bee Hive** – Cllr Campbell outlined a project to site a bee hive on parish land. Suggestions to look at included the allotments, the wildflower meadow and Woodpecker Hill Wood, Cllr Campbell will be carrying out risk assessments of all sites and will report back to the next meeting with her preference. It was agreed that this would be an excellent idea and as a member of the local and national Bee Keeping Association Cllr Campbell agreed to lead this project.

**New Councillors** - I am pleased to welcome two new members to the council, Ant Mann and Richard Burton who take up the two vacancies. We are now at full capacity again and I am looking forward to working with your new council.

There is no meeting for Parish Council in August so the next meeting will be held in Pettiward Hall on Monday, 11 September 2023 at 7.30pm please feel free to join us.

# **Concern over SCC budget position**

At Cabinet on 13 June, our group raised concerns about the significant extra expenditure announced by the Conservative administration since the 2023-24 budget was set in February. Cabinet were reviewing the 2022-23 finances against the budget that was set, including an overspend of £27.7m and a significant £57.2m taken out of Council reserves – the council's 'safety net' funds to be used when needed.

On 16 May 2023 the Cabinet announced that an extra unbudgeted £720k would be found to cover the £60k monthly shortfall for Suffolk Libraries for a year, and at the council AGM on 25 May the Leader of the Council, Cllr Matthew Hicks, announced a further unbudgeted additional £10m for road surfacing in the next 20 months. Given that neither of these items were budgeted for only a few months ago when the current budget was set, my group raised concerns in the meeting whether the administration's budget setting procedures were sufficiently robust.

## **North Falls Offshore Wind Farm**

On 13 June, Cabinet reviewed the consultation response for the extension of the North Falls wind farm. The wind farm is situated just off the Essex coast so Suffolk County Council is a consultee rather than a decision maker.

# National Grid Reinforcement Works between Bramford and Twinstead

The Cabinet also reviewed and approved a response to the Planning Inspectorate on upgrading the power lines between the villages of Twinstead in Essex and Bramford in Mid Suffolk. There were concerns about the impact of the works to the local countryside, particularly the Dedham Vale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, where the National Grid have agreed to lay cables underground.

# **Missing Child Reports in Suffolk**

The recent reports in the press that nearly 3000 missing child reports were received by Suffolk Constabulary between April 2022 & March 2023 deeply shocked our group. The reports involved 719 children across the county with some going missing several times during the period. The majority of the children reported missing are in care settings such as children's homes and foster care. We asked the administration at SCC to do more to support children in care, who are among the most vulnerable in Suffolk.

# **Church Road Meeting with Highways Officer**

A useful meeting to see what could or could not be done to help. Paula has notes. Also discussion about changing the priority on the Knights bridge. This could cause more problems.

# **Review of DIY Refuse Charges**

The government has announced a proposal to abolish council charges for DIY waste but a timetable has still to be set, but likely to be later this year. Details of current position on the website.

# Make use of the **village communal herb garden**! This recipe uses French Tarragon, abundant in the herb garden.





# Tarragon Chicken & mushroom

Sauté in olive oil 3 shallots + 1 leek finely chopped, add 1 clove of garlic finely chopped. Remove from pan & set aside in dish. Add a little more olive oil and a generous knob of salted butter, to this add 250grms of chestnut mushrooms halved and sauté, season with Knorr Aromat seasoning. Remove from pan & set aside in dish.

Add a little more olive oil to the pan if needed & brown the pre-seasoned free range chicken breasts, when coloured nicely remove from pan.

Add 300mls of white wine to the pan and deglaze the pan, reduce by half before adding a pint of chicken stock (essential cuisine No1 chicken gravy if you have it) to this added a good 2 tablespoon of fresh chopped tarragon. Add a dessertspoon of chicken glace if you have it.

Now return the chicken, mushrooms & shallots etc. to the pan and cook on simmering heat for 30 minutes.

Finely, add 50mls of double cream and fresh chopped tarragon 10 minutes before the end of cooking. Enjoy! **Peter Turner**

# **Community Speedwatch**

Community Speedwatch is a national initiative where proactive members of local communities join with the support and supervision of their local police to record details of speeding vehicles using approved detection devices.



As you have probably noticed the Community Speedwatch team in Great Finborough have not been out and about along High Road for some time. Unfortunately we have struggled to recruit a team of volunteers to enable us to carry out the checks. We would like to remedy this as soon as possible and request that if you have concerns about the speed of traffic through the village and can spare some time to help please consider volunteering for this very important role.

We must have at least three people at each session and if you can spare even a couple of hours every so often please do come forward.

We live in a rural area where fatalities are four times more likely to happen than in urban areas and road safety has a tendency to focus on the number of collision casualties alone. In Great Finborough speeding is one of the main concerns brought to Parish Council by our residents and it seems quality of life and feeling safe when using our roads recreationally is equally important to you.



Community Speedwatch is proven to reduce the speed of vehicles travelling through rural villages; it is a proactive solution to improve the safety of our community. It's not "a waste of time" or "what's the point if we can't issue fines" Registered keepers of vehicles exceeding the speed limit are contacted – initially with a letter explaining the potential risks

and consequences of their dangerous behaviour. Repeat offenders will receive a visit from the local police, irrespective of where they live. Beyond these friendly gestures, focused enforcement and criminal prosecution follow based on the collated evidence.

It would be great to get the Great Finborough scheme back up and running, training and equipment is provided and it really does work. Please contact the Parish Clerk or any of your councillors if you think you can help.

#### Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk

September brings a new school year, one of my children is in primary school and the other secondary. Between uniforms, PE kit and knowing they'll need to catch the bus each day the costs are adding up. I'm already stretched, I'm not sure how to cover these extra outgoings. Is there any help I can get?

A new school year can put pressure on people's budgets, so you're not alone in your worries, but help is available. If you are online, the Citizens Advice website is a good place to start where you'll find lots of information on the support you might be entitled to for school-related costs, at <a href="mailto:citizensadvice.org.uk/family/education/help-with-school-costs">citizensadvice.org.uk/family/education/help-with-school-costs</a>. The help you can get to cover school lunches will vary depending on how old your children are and if you claim benefits. All children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

If your child can't walk to school because of special educational needs or disabilities they should get free school transport. You may be able to get help with transport costs from Suffolk County Council (SCC) if your children can't walk because it's dangerous or too far.

If you're on a low income, SCC may also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs. You're likely to be considered to be on a low income if you get means-tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. In some places there are also local charitable schemes that can help. A good place to find out about these is the school itself or Parent Teacher Association (PTA), as both should know if these kinds of schemes exist. Many families are feeling the squeeze at the moment, but it's important to remember help is available with school costs. 


