

#### **Editorial**

The Autumn is fast approaching after some reasonably good summer weather this year. Time to check the oil tank and the log store in preparation for the colder weather to come. Cheer up I am only joking it's not going to be that bad.

Simon is just back from Continental Europe after his latest visit, apparently there were still one or two niggling Brexit problems still to be resolved. For those who can remember that far back I offered a bottle of wine for the most mistakes identified in the July/August edition of the newsletter. Nobody entered, which surprised me somewhat, so the 1979 bottle of Chateau Lafite has been carefully returned to the cellar.

The builders are making good progress with the installation of the toilet and kitchenette at **St Andrews Church**, the outside work has been completed and the internal work is well underway, the project is on target to be completed by 28 October. St Andrews church will be holding its Autumn supper on the 28 October in Pettiward Hall, it will be a fun night with excellent food. See page 16

The **Defibrillator** is on order and should be installed in the old phone box in the next few weeks, a huge thank you to the **National Lotteries Big Lottery Fund** for the grant to make this possible.

Two other projects which have been sanctioned by the Parish Council are the provision of **speed indicator device**, which has been part funded from the locality budgets of Penny Otton and John Matthissen. Secondly, improvements to the parking area in Church Road. For more details see Parish Council matters on page 4.

#### **Parish Council Matters**

Extracts from the Parish Council meeting held on the 11 September. **Clerks report** – The grit bin for the primary school triangle has been delivered and the contribution from Cllr Otton banked.

MSDC annual external playground inspection has been carried out and we await their report. Interim playground checks are being carried out by Cllrs Tarabella and Turner with records kept by the clerk

Inconsiderate drivers parking in Valley Lane have been asked to refrain from damaging the verges and pull in. SCC Highways have agreed to repair the existing damage and erect some "passing only" signs.

**Provision of Defibrillator** – It was noted that the contractor engaged to clean the phone box has promised this will be carried out by next week. It was confirmed that the equipment had been ordered and the installation will be carried out by Community Heartbeat trust as soon as possible. Training sessions and a resident awareness programme will be arranged once the equipment has been installed.

**Provision of Speed Indicator Device** — The SCC site survey and approvals was noted. It was agreed to action 9 sites approved. Site no. 2 has existing solar speed indicator device and it was agreed that this should remain therefore this post cannot be used for the new mobile device. It was resolved to purchase the Tempodis 230 Si from Radarlux as quoted at 2710 euros, a British stockist will be sought before placing an order from Germany.

**Church Road parking improvements** – SCC Highways have visited the site and given support for the improvements with a recommendation that bull nose edging is use where the area abuts the highway. Zoey Banthorpe at MSDC has confirmed that S106 money would not be available to help funding. Following discussion and consideration of the budget, funding and quotes for the improvement to the parking area in Church road it was resolved to engage The Earth tree Company to carry out the tree work and D J Haill to lay tarmac and bull nose edging. The total cost of this work not exceed £5400 under this resolution.

#### **Health walks**

Even if you have not been prescribed a routine of health walks by your doctor, a stroll round our villages is always rewarding. In the Crown in Buxhall you can check out a copy (if you don't already have one) of Malcolm Manning's handy guide to all the footpaths in the village and choose a route to suit. In Great Finborough the most straightforward option is to go along the High Road to Pear Tree Place and walk through Woodpecker Hill and the football pitch until you reach Valley Lane, then follow Valley Lane back to the Chestnut Horse and thus complete the circuit. Onehouse has a map of its footpaths on the wall of the Community Centre in Forest Road with Northfield Woods the nearby starting point for various routes. At the Chilton playing field there is an outdoor gym if you are looking for more vigorous exercise.

#### Food banks

The school holidays always lead to extra demand on the stocks of food banks, so please spare a thought next time you are shopping, and drop an item or two into the trolleys at most local supermarkets or the boxes at almost all local churches.

#### **Local Plan**

A first draft of the new Local Plan is now available for public comment until November 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a very important document for the future of our villages so I encourage everyone to have a look at the issues and questions that are set out, as well as the maps of each village showing parcels of land that are being considered for possible future development over the next twenty years. Across the District not all of these will be approved for the final document so your views at this stage may have an influence. It is important to understand that Government is requiring villages to say where they would like development rather than merely saying they do not want development. This is in line with Government's directive for Neighbourhood Plans, which are currently being worked on by at least fifteen villages in Mid Suffolk. The Local Plan documents, available at <a href="https://www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/jointlocalplan">www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/jointlocalplan</a> contain numerous questions but from my long experience of consultation documents there is a tendency to constrain views within a convenient

framework. I would urge everyone responding to go beyond the questions if necessary to ensure your views are fully expressed. If you can't find anywhere to submit what you want to say, please email me directly and I will ensure that your views are included.

#### From the Rectory October 2017

I was standing in a churchyard yesterday with some family who were about to bury the ashes of their mother who had reached the age of 95. We ruminated on her long life, the fact that it had been 9 months since she died and how *time* 'seemed to fly' these days. As we stood near the graves of so many people they knew and a fair few I remembered —



we wondered about *time* and how although it goes at the same speed now as it always has, it doesn't seem to - does it? Perhaps it's a consequence of aging but *time* seems to go so quickly for many of us.

A couple of years ago Wendy and I visited the Salvador Dali museum in Figures northern Spain. I bought a couple of his prints. One of them I particularly like is of a clock face that is somehow stretched irregularly over the edge of a table. It gives the impression of *time* being fluid. I am sure we can all think of occasions when time has seemed to go so slowly, waiting for an appointment, listening to someone talk, recuperating following an illness and then again other times when it has gone like lightning - enjoying a meal with friends, a holiday, listening to someone talk.

But back to the churchyard and we wondered about the sense of *time* that mother had in her life. We cannot possibly know, but we do know that it seems that people of her generation appeared to have more of it. I wonder if that has always been so? Perhaps it is because they did less than us and certainly many had far less opportunity. There was little ability to go far and certainly much less chance to learn or engage and build a better life.

The schools are back and well and truly into the swing of it, the farms are busy, the holidays and restful times are over for many, but however *time* seems to you, I hope and pray that you will use it to your advantage especially the quiet times to perhaps just sit and let the mind swirl with what it has picked up in the busier times – then great thoughts sometimes come – as to how we might use the time left to us in our lives.

donate in person, or if you prefer to donate by post to Andrew Robinson, Treasurer, 30 Willow Close, Great Finborough IP14 3BF.



#### SUFFOIK APPLE CAKE

#### Method:

Pre-heat the oven to 165°C or gas mark 4. Grease and line a 20cm cake tin.

- 1. Peel and slice the cooking apples into eighths and mix with the caster sugar. Cook in a pan over a medium heat until soft but still whole.
  - Leave to cool.
- 2. When cool, chop the cooked apples roughly into 2cmdice and combine with the flour and spices in a large mixing bowl.
- 3. Meanwhile combine the margarine and brown sugar in the bowl of a mixer and beat at a medium speed until very pale and fluffy.
- 4. Beat the eggs together and, with the mixer still running, slowly combine the eggs with the margarine/sugar mixture.
- 5. Fold in the apple and flour mix and transfer to your lined cake tin.

#### **Ingredients**

500g cooking apple, 50g caster suger,300g cooking margarine,300g flour,300g of light brown suger,6 free range eggs (room temp.)2g of cinnamon & 2g ground mixed spice.

#### Topping

150g eating apples, 50g oats, 25g cooking margarine & 25g caster sugar.

#### For the topping

- Peel and slice the eating apples into small pieces and caramelize them in a pan over a medium heat using a little butter and sugar.
- 2. Combine the oats, margarine and sugar to form a crumble mixture.
- Decorate the top of the cake with slices of apple (one per slice) and crumble mixture.

Bake in the oven for 45 minutes or until a sharp knife inserted into the center of the cake comes away clean. Cool on a baking rack. ENJOY!

This summer has been a traditional mixture of weather finishing with some very dry and sunny days. Also, the time has come to start the autumn tidy up of the beds (when the rain finally arrives to soften the ground), tidy/prune and feed those specimens remaining and to plan the spring bulb displays. The September meeting saw us welcome Peter Miller from Kings Seeds, Peter gave a fascinating talk about the history of Kings and the workings of the seed world, with lots of useful information on general propagation as well as telling us how to get the very best from sweet peas. The next meeting will be on the 12th October at the usual time of 7.30PM in the Upper room of the Pettiward Hall, and will feature Andrew Brogan who founded Henstead Hardy Exotic Garden. He will let us in on the secrets of growing exotic plants in the UK and how to manage without taking them undercover for the winter. #### **Chernobyl Children's Life Line & charity Shop**

I have just returned from our weeklong "goodwill Mission" to Belarus. Of the 20 people on the trip 7 came from Mid Suffolk. Everyone agreed without doubt; "no words, photographs or videos can truly give you the real picture". All who took part enjoyed the trip although at times it was emotionally hard but still very rewarding. One of our group was only 12 years old but she was a great part of the team, joining in everything and helping wherever she could. Everyone commented what an amazing attitude she had and as we restructure and redefine our itinerates we hope that more young people will want to join us in the future. These are some of the main points of this year's trip" In Minsk, we visited the Children's Cancer Hospital, the No 1 Baby Home and the Early Intervention Centre for young children.

Moving on to Stolin we met with the officers of the Education Department who explained to the group how vital the work of the Charity is in helping the

children of their area. Then onto the children's department of the local hospital delivering vital items of medical equipment and aid, things that we take for granted will be in hospitals but they have in either very limited quantities or not at all. Later the group was divided into "working parties" who visited with local families, offering their services to help them and to learn the reality of life in Belarus. We all had different tasks assigned and how different from the UK. Having to borrow a knife from a neighbour as there was only one in the house. cutting wallpaper with kids scissors and using a child's bed as a paste table. knocking up a "table" from odd wood and bits and pieces to be used to stand on to reach the windows to be washed, these are just some examples of the resourcefulness of the people when they have nothing else available. Onwards to Yaglavichi Village meeting with Father Vitali the Priest who is spearheading "Project Share" in conjunction with our Charity. This is a declared "clean area" so facilitates the building of a respite facility to allow children not well enough or able to travel for a variety of reasons so that they may enjoy the same benefits of respite that the children who come to the UK do. This also presents volunteering opportunities for anyone interested in getting involved. We also had the privilege of being invited to attend the opening ceremony which takes place at the beginning of each new school year. This known as "First Bell" and is a very old tradition in Belarus where the pupils in their final year welcome the newcomers to the school. We donated stationery to the school and this was met with tremendous gratitude. The Headmaster had placed a box in the school hall inviting anyone to donate items to help those children who could not provide their own equipment, when we arrived it held 3 or 4 items, when we left it was overflowing! Further visits were made to other facilities again to donate much needed aid and provide support for the children.

Four children will travel to the UK for a group visit in December. The girls will be touch with me as soon as possible as we need to start organising this now as aged between 9 and 12 years so we are very keen to receive donations of clothing to provide for them whilst they are here and to take home with them. Not only will the break be invaluable to their health, getting them away from the severe winter but they will also get to experience Christmas in the UK! For some of the less fortunate children we encountered on our travels we are again going to try to match them up with people in the UK who would like to send them a present at Christmas. Details and photographs of each child will be supplied together with a list of suggested small gifts. If you would like to be involved in this part of our program please get in it can take from 4 to 8 weeks for parcels to get to the children


