Great Finborough Parish Council

A meeting of the Parish Council was held in the upstairs room of Pettiward Hall at 7.30pm on Monday 14 November.

Reports were heard from both District and County councillors.

A report was heard from Woodpecker Hill wood working group asking for a donation to provide tools to keep the wood in good order. It was agreed that they would provide costings and an application to our District Councillors' locality budget would be made. If there is no money to be had from this budget then the PC would look at purchasing the tools.

It was resolved to submit an objection to planning application DC/22/04867, Submission of details (Reserved Matters) and Discharge of Condition 7 (Construction management strategy) under Outline Planning Permission DC/21/02077 to consider Appearance, Landscaping, Layout and Scale of erection of 4no dwellings and garages - Land Rear of East House, High Road. Full details of the objection can be found on the minutes of this meeting.

It was resolved to submit a comment of "no objection at this time" to DC/22/04659 Erection of a two storey side extension including replacement roof to rear extension and erection of cart lodge (following demolition of existing garage) 4 Wash Lane Corner, Combs Lane.

Other decisions made by Mid Suffolk District Council Planning team were noted.

It was agreed that the Budget Working Group would meet prior to next months meeting to consider the budget for 2023/2024 and to table recommendations for the Parish Councils discussion.

It was agreed to trial the new Facebook page for the Parish Council and gather feedback on its effectiveness. Thanks to Lee for his work on this matter.

It was agreed to get a quote for the erection of the white gates for the entrance to the village from Hitcham. The gates should be delivered this month.

It was agreed to purchase wood chippings for renewing the surfacing on the pathways around the allotments and the cut through to Willow Close.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Monday 12 December at 7.30pm in the upstairs meeting room of Pettiward Hall.

You can still register to vote by post and confirm your identity with a signature.www.gov.uk/government/publications/apply-for-a-postal-vote But, if you want to vote at a polling station you will need to prove your identity by showing photo ID. If you don't have a passport or driving licence, the council will be able to verify your identify and issue an identity document, but so far the government has not passed the secondary legislation to say how this will happen.

Hidden Talents

Although born in Holloway, north London, at about the age of 5 the Grimaldi family moved to Norfolk during the war. There, John Grimaldi started his schooling. At the end of the war the family moved to Bexley Heath, Kent. He met Brenda at a local fencing club, a sport in which he was very talented. On leaving school he went to Borough Polytechnic at the Elephant and Castle, South London where he studied to be a dental technologist. Called up to do National Service in the Royal Army Medical Corps, after basic training, he was posted to Aldershot, where he worked in the pathology laboratory of the military hospital there. John was put in charge of the sterilising department after only 3 months, pretty rapid promotion.

John's captain from his civilian fencing club wrote to the commanding officer to beg that he be allowed to compete for his club against the Royal Marines and after success in that competition, the commanding officer proposed he be assigned to the Army's fencing team. 2 days later, John reported to the British Army's fencing school, the culmination of his National Service being his performance in the Royal Tournament at Earls Court.

On leaving the Army, John worked as a dental technician but, at the same time, having been recommended to become a fencing teacher, he enrolled at the National Fencing School in Regent Street. After this he taught fencing in the evenings for a number of years. Still in the 1950s, John started to use his lunch hours to learn about clock making and repair from a craftsman, George Clark, in new Eltham; and became fascinated. For the tuition he received, he did jewellery repairs. He bought books to further his knowledge and practise his skills.

Jewellery making and clock/watch repairs remained a hobby until John and Brenda decided to move with their daughter, Anne, to Great Finborough in 1973. They wanted a country lifestyle and had close relatives in Suffolk. John found that "nobody wanted private dentistry" and work was scarce. For some time John had been teaching himself how to make jewellery, mostly for his wife. Brenda was asked by a

work colleague when she took some of his jewellery to show her friends at work, whether the couple had seen a television programme about a jewellery designer operating from premises in Honiton. They had not but John made contact with the designer and they arranged to meet so he could show her some of his work.

The result of this first meeting was the offer of a 6 week trial period but, only 2 weeks later, John was offered a full time job. This lasted 2 years until the designer moved to Glasgow. Then John started knocking on doors and contacting a number of jewellers locally and as far afield as St Ives. He was able to make his living from his workshop at Westlegate (opposite St Andrew's Church), and built up a reputation for work of the highest standard and he produced prestigious pieces for highly reputable jewellers. I have been shown some beautiful examples of his work, which is delicate, fine and nothing short of beautiful. Alongside the jewellery making, John did clock and watch repairs until he retired in 1990.

In a period when he was teaching fencing at Stowmarket Leisure Centre, John got into air pistol shooting and later into rifle shooting. He proudly told me that, as treasurer of the pistol club, he turned the 3 shillings and sixpence in the coffers to over £2,000 during his tenure. In competition, he rates his best achievements being at Bisley and against the Police. He has the medals as proof!

John and Brenda have both been parish councillors doing their bit for the village community. John did lots of physical work in Pettiward Hall: painting ceilings, sanding floors and knocking through holes in walls to make the double doors between the main hall and side entrance area. He set up an engineering workshop when he retired as a facility that anyone could come to for help with repairing a huge range of different artefacts. The gates at the entrance porch to the church and the arch above, as well as the gates to the school grounds and opposite Westlegate, are also his work. Repairs, alterations and improvements inside the church are just too numerous to mention.

SODS (Stowmarket Operatic and Drama Society) and TWAM (Tools with a Mission) are two other organisations for which John has volunteered. Until the pandemic, he helped to make the scenery for SODS. For TWAM, his repaired tools and machinery were shipped off to countries in the developing world. He reads a lot and has been an active member of Great Finborough's book club. He will be 89 in December and wants to live to be 101 years old.

John, we wish you well.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk

"Last year I fell for a scam when I was doing my Christmas shopping. The scam was clever. I thought I was getting a good deal but didn't realise I was being scammed until it was too late. How can I avoid the same thing happening again this year?"

Scammers' tactics become more sophisticated every year, making scams tricky to recognise, but there are things you can look out for.

If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. For example, tickets to an event that are much cheaper than they're being sold elsewhere, or a holiday that's a lot less than you'd expect to pay.

Be wary of people contacting you out of the blue on social media sites or via text and email offering an item for sale or deal on something. Do your research. If you're buying from a website you haven't used before, spend a few minutes researching it. A good place to start is finding a website's terms and conditions. You should also look up the company's address, this can normally be found in the website's 'contact us' section and should have a street name, not just a PO box. If it's a registered UK company you can check its details on the Companies House website at gov.uk/get-information-about-a-company

Check to see what people have said about the company. It's worth looking at different review websites to see other people's feedback – don't rely on reviews the company has put on its own website.

Scammers will often ask you to pay in an unusual way, or very quickly. For example, you're asked to send money through a transfer service like MoneyGram or Western Union or pay via vouchers. Remember never give away your personal information like a password or PIN and never click on or download anything you don't trust.

If you've transferred money, speak to your bank and the police. You should also contact the police if the scammer is in your area or you feel unsafe.

Don't feel embarrassed about reporting a scam – scammers are clever and it can happen to anyone. Reporting a scam helps track down and stop scammers, helping to prevent it from happening to others too.


