Great Finborough Parish Council

A meeting of the Parish Council was held in the upstairs room of Pettiward Hall at 7.30pm on Monday 9 May.

The final accounts for the year ending 31 March 2022 were approved and section 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return, Accounting Statements 2021/22, was signed.

It was RESOLVED to adopt the Local Government Association (LGA) Model Councillor Code of Conduct 2020.

Cllr Turner reported that discussions with the land owner at Hitcham end of High Road had resulted in permission to site gates approx 80-100m from the first house on both sides of the road. It was noted that this will be outside the 30MPH limits however it was thought that an application to SCC Highways should explain the lack of alternative sites and the importance of speed reduction and hope that they will grant the licence.

The report and recommendations from the Local Needs Housing Working Group were considered and discussed. It was RESOLVED to support the preferred sites recommendation. The Clerk will make contact with MSDC Robert Feakes to arrange stakeholder meetings.

A report from the Street Lights Working Group confirmed that a requote from Karl Lockwood the SCC Engineer was awaited and various funding streams were being investigated.

It was RESOLVED to replace the notice board with a new manmade timber one in a similar size with the name in gold

Rewilding green areas

The District Council and some parishes are starting to manage some green spaces differently. These may look a little untidy, but please understand this is not about saving money but giving our insects somewhere to live and to feed, so that they in turn will provide food for birds, bats, larger insects and small mammals. Insects also pollinate crops in fields, allotments and vegetable gardens.

The collapse of insect numbers in the last couple of decades especially is under-mining the whole cycle of the natural world.

Invasive species clearance - practical conservation work

I am looking for volunteers to remove Himalayan Balsam beside the River Ratt, both on the biodiversity land off Wash Lane and other local riverside areas. Left to grow and spread, this suffocates many native species of plants and thus other wildlife. A good start was made by a team from the museum last year, but the *Kickstart* Government scheme has ended, while the regrowth of Balsam has begun again. Welded to Great Finborough

Although not born in Gt Finborough his family home has been here for hundreds of years. Graham Chaplin's dad was in Kent doing war service when Graham and his brothers were born and at the age of four was brought to Gt Finborough to the family house. His Family date back to 1524 so you can say he really does have true history to this village.

Graham is an Artist Blacksmith with a huge talent and just some of his work can be seen around the village. If you were to walk along Church Road you will see in his front garden a sculpture of a RSJ tied in a knot. But keep looking and if you haven't seen it already there on his garage roof is a forged iron dragon. The dragon measures 17 feet from the fiery nostrils to the tip of its tail and is made up with 3000 scales each one carefully crafted by Graham. Just these two artifacts show the breath of his talent. But talent seems to run in the family because Graham's dad is a second cousin to the very famous and exceedingly talented Charlie Chaplin. Two men, artists in their own right.

When growing up he lived with all the family in the Poplars which is at the junction of the High Road and Borough Lane. His grandfather had a stocking factory at this location which employed many of the girls in Gt Finborough and beyond. Although called a stocking factory it produced what we know as socks and these were of many different sizes and varieties. The business went from father to son but Graham's dad didn't follow in his father's footsteps instead opening a garage on this site serving petrol and doing car servicing. At the age of 11 Graham moved with the family to larger business premises in Buxhall.

Graham went to our primary school and then onto Stowmarket High School and eventually attending the Civic College in Ipswich. His apprenticeship allowed him to attend college while learning his engineering and welding trade which gave him the confidence to travel the country as a Coded Welder. The journeymen lifestyle was not conducive to bring up a family so when he met Marie he bought a house in Stowmarket and started his family. After six years and with

two baby boys he decided that there was only one place to settle and raise a family and that was his beloved Great Finborough.

Business was busy, very busy. He was doing structural engineering, general welding and at the same time developing his artistic skills. He had a small forge in his garage and employed nearly two dozen men to meet the demand. After 22 years of working very long hours he decided as he puts it to "quietly step lightly sideways" and sold his business to Michael the man he had managing it. It is still going today "Miktek" on the Earnest Nunn industrial estate on the way to Needham Market.

Graham set up a forge in Buxhall and concentrated on just doing smithing. His work is wide and varied and as a member of the Artist Blacksmith Association and the Worshipful Company of Blacksmiths he was being recognised both at home and abroad. When the Globe Theatre was being brought back to life on London's South Bank Graham was selected from Smiths from many different countries to do work on the newly designed gates. This level of skill from his many different creations was rewarded with a Bronze Medal from the Worshipful Company of Blacksmiths (the oldest in the country founded in 1225), followed two years later by a Silver Medal. Finally, he was awarded a "Fellowship" of the W.C.B. and this honour he is rightly very proud of.

During his working life Graham has attended Madingly House University doing a host of different subjects and also Ipswich College where he gained an M.A. Hons.in Fine Arts. One or two examples of his work can be seen around the village. The picture of the chestnut horse above the door to the pub is his, also the village sign on the green, as well as the seat below.

You may see his 6ft.3in frame walking around the village because this is what he loves to do. He and Marie and their two best friends some years ago walked 205 miles across the country raising money for the MacMillan Trust, Cancer Research and the Children's Hospice

Treehouse Appeal. This was then followed by further charitable fund raiser by a coast road trip in a 1961, Rover 100 round England, Wales and Scotland. But what started these efforts was a solo cycle ride from Lands End to John O Groats. The culmination of all this charitable work is writing and illustrating a book about the life of children between 1948 and 1963 in the Great Finborough, Buxhall and Rattlesten area. It is called "Please try not to be late for tea" and all profits from this publication go to charity.

Finally, not only is Graham a highly skilled metalworker having made many beautiful pieces, he is also an artist.





I am a single parent, with two young children. I am already struggling to stay on top of my household bills; my weekly food shop isn't stretching as far anymore and now my energy bill is going up too. I don't know how I'm going to afford all of these price rises. What can I do to stop my finances spiralling out of control?

First of all, you are not alone in this and there's support to help you.

It's always worth checking if there are benefits you don't know about that you're eligible for, including support with your energy costs and living costs. On the Citizens Advice website - citizensadvice.org.uk - there's a benefits calculator, advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income.

There's also emergency support that you may have access to, such as food bank vouchers or fuel vouchers.

If you're struggling to stay on top of bills, it's really important to understand what money you have coming in and going out each month. Citizens Advice also has a budgeting tool on its website that can help with this.

If you're already behind on bills, prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first. Not paying these bills has the most serious consequences. You should speak to the person or company you owe money to, to see if they can help you repay your bills sustainably.

We know that times are incredibly tough but please remember, you don't have to face this alone, so do contact Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk to help you find a way forward.
