

# The Village 'Big Lunch' to Celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III - Sunday, 7 May 2023, 1pm - 5pm in the Village Car Park

Plans are now well underway for the village coronation celebrations. The picnic in the village car park starts at 1pm. There will be some tables and chairs available on a first come basis but you can bring your own or a blanket, weather permitting.

#### **Great Finborough Garden Club**

Spring is truly here with its changeable weather as evidenced by the heavy showers of cold rain to the unseasonably high temperatures tempting the unwary to shed layers of clothing and release the seedlings from the greenhouse. The tulips are looking magnificent this year and all the early trees seem to have an abundance of blossom, hopefully a foretaste of things to come.

Our April Meeting saw us welcome Jan Michalak who gave us a fascinating insight into the flora of New Zealand. His talk covered the way in which the geological history of the country drove the proliferation of flightless birds taking over the role of mammals in other countries. This has led to the huge number of plants with either no or very few leaves, many thorny species and those which form dense tangles of branches to protect the flowers and fruit.

Members were asked to propose candidates for the recipients of fund raised at Open Gardens this year. A vote taken at the meeting elected The Pettiward Hall roofing fund as the recipients of 75% of funds raised. The remaining 25% will go to the bee charity supported by our March speaker Jane Tuke. Open Gardens is getting ever closer and preparations for the event on 25 June are already underway, more details will be available soon, along with requests for help from the Committee for members to help run this event which is our major charity fundraiser.

The May meeting will feature Saffron Summerfield presenting her illustrated talk on birdsong and calls. The meeting will take place in the Main Room of the Pettiward Hall on the 11 May at 7.30pm.

All villagers are welcome to come along, bring a picnic and your own drinks. There will also be a BBQ and the Chestnut Horse will be open as usual.



#### **Letter from Combs Rectory**



The month of May heralds an event that many of us will never have experienced before, namely the Coronation of a new monarch. But I know there are many amongst you who remember the late Queen's Coronation in 1953 on a very wet day in June, let's pray that Saturday 6 May dawns dry and bright and remains that way for the weekend!

The Church of England will play an integral part in the Coronation ceremony at Westminster Abbey, which although an occasion for pageantry and celebration, is also a solemn religious ceremony that has remained essentially the same over a thousand years. For the last 900 years, the ceremony has taken place at Westminster Abbey, London. The service is conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, whose task this has almost always been since the Norman Conquest in 1066.

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have recently written to all clergy in the Church of England regarding this momentous event and I include an extract below:

"Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We are writing to you to share with you our hopes, desires and prayers for the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III on the 6 May. The Coronation will be a historic moment in the life of our nation; a time to reflect on our history, reflect and celebrate something of who we are, and look forward.

The Coronation is steeped in this country's traditions and filled with great symbolism. It is essentially a consecration to service. Happening within a Eucharist, the most basic and the central act of Christian worship, it includes oaths, regalia and crowning. Through it we receive

from Jesus the one who comes to us as a servant; the one who is the king of Kings.

The Coronation weekend and bank holiday is aimed at bringing the nation together in common meals and in helping and serving our communities through the <u>Coronation Big Lunch</u> and the <u>Big Help Out.</u> It is, of course, part of every Christian's witness to commit joyfully to a life of service to God and one another; a commitment the King has exemplified throughout his life. We pray this would be a moment for all to encounter afresh the person of Jesus Christ – the servant King – and be renewed in our calling to serve Him by serving others.

At the heart of communities across the country, particularly through your ministry, the <u>Church of England</u> will provide space for prayer and worship, as well as events where people of all faiths and none can gather together. This is a moment for us to witness to the love of Jesus Christ and a chance, in partnership with many others, to reach out and serve our communities."

Across the villages served by our parish magazines I know there will be many events taking place over the Coronation weekend which I hope you will be able to engage in and enjoy. The Combs and Finborough Benefice will be holding a special Coronation Evensong service on Sunday, 7 May, 6pm at St Mary's, Buxhall at which our choir will be enriching our worship with Coronation themed pieces. We do hope you'll be able to join us for this service to give thanks for our new monarch, King Charles III.

#### **Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk**

I recently started a new job where my boss has told me I'll have to work on bank holidays. This was never the case in my old job. Can my employer make me work on a public holiday, and should I get paid extra if I do?

When it comes to bank holidays, whether or not staff have to work is up to their employer, and you don't have to be paid more if you do. Unless your contract says you'll be paid extra for working bank holidays, you will just be paid your normal amount.

The situation will vary from job to job and may depend on a number of factors such as whether your place of work is open on bank holidays, your hours of work and crucially, what your contract says. Take a look at your contract, if you have one, to find out what your personal situation is. Your contract might say you will always get bank holidays off but it could say you are sometimes required to work or will always be required to work. If your place of work is normally open on a bank holiday you'll probably be asked to work at least some.

Your contract might say something like: "In addition to bank and public holidays, your annual entitlement to holidays is X days". This means you get public holidays off in addition to your annual leave entitlement but it might not mean you're entitled to take the specific days off. You may be required to work a bank holiday, in which case you should get another day off instead.

Alternatively, it might say something like: "Your annual holiday entitlement (inclusive of bank and public holidays) is X days" - this means you have to take bank holidays off as part of your annual leave entitlement. Bank holidays will either be deducted from your annual leave allowance (so you'll have to book all bank holidays as paid time off) or counted as additional holiday days.

If you don't have a contract, the legal default position is that your employer can tell you when you can or can't take time off.

If you find you need to resolve an issue with your employer, first ask for an informal chat, where you can raise your concerns. If this doesn't get you anywhere, you may need to raise a formal grievance. If you need advice on this, Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can help.




